**Finance Commission team in Bihar on 3-day visit**

PATNA, SEPT 30 /-/ A team of the 15th Finance Commission, led by its chief N K Singh, has started a three-day visit to Bihar, beginning Monday. The finance panel will take part in a national seminar on "Addressing the problems of inter-state and inter-district disparity of India" on Monday, according to a press release. The seminar, which is being organised by Asian Development Research Institute (ADRI), will be addressed by N K Singh while Bihar Assembly Speaker Vijay Kumar Choudhary will preside over the function. Jharkhand Parliamentary Affairs, Food and Supply Minister Nitish Kumar will deliver the special address at the seminar. During the tour, the team would gather feedback from the state for making recommendations to the Centre on allocation of funds. The other members of the team are Shaktikanta Das, Anoop Singh, Sushok Lahiri and Rakesh Chand.

The members of the panel will have meetings with the state ministers, political parties, panchayati raj organisations, urban local bodies and representatives of trade and industry. The commission is a statutory body constituted every five years to devise a formula for allocation of net central tax proceeds between the Centre and states. It will give its recommendations for devolution of taxes and other fiscal matters for five years commencing on April 2020. (PTI)

**MUTA sets pre-conditions for talks on Manipur University**

IMPHAL, SEPT 30 /-/ The Manipur University Teachers Association (MUTA) has said that they will sit for talks to end a month-long agitation only after their demands, including "unconditional release" of 15 teachers and students, are met.

The students and teachers of the Manipur University were arrested on September 21. A team of officers had raided the university hostel and the residential quarters and took the students and the teachers into custody based on a complaint filed by newly appointed acting vice-chancellor K Yugindro Singh. MUTA also demanded withdrawal of the FIR lodged by Yardi against 15 teachers and all security forces from the university campus as a pre-condition for talks, it said in a statement Saturday night. The teachers' body strongly condemned the

action of security forces on September 21, but welcomed any move by an individual or organisation keen on bringing an end to the crisis which began from May 30 after Manipur University Students Union (MUSU) launched agitation for removal of now suspended Vice-chancellor Prof A P Pandey.

The MUTA statement followed the Friday letter of chief minister N Biren Singh to the university community asking them to sit for talks to bring about an amicable solution. Police on Saturday arrested one person, believed to be a cadre of a political party, for his alleged involvement in throwing eggs on the university's main gate. A rally on Sunday passed on a wall of a building in Imphal, a purposed video of which has been circulating on social media. (PTI)

**All aid to Bru refugees to stop from Monday: Centre**

AGARTALA, SEPT 30 /-/ The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) would desist in giving kilos of substance allowances, including ration supplies and cash dole, to the Bru refugees from Monday, an official notification said. The notification was issued by the sub-divisional magistrate of Panisagar in North Tripura district, Lalnemmemi Darlong, on Saturday.

The MHA has directed to stop all kinds of allowances, including cash dole, and ration supplies from October 1, to the Mizoram Bru refugees, sheltered in six evacuee camps in North Tripura district

in Tripura. The MHA instruction came on September 25. MHA Spokesperson Secretary (Internal Security) Rupa Mitra, Joint Secretary Satyendra Garg and others had said in August that all refugee camps in Tripura would be shut down if the Brus failed to return to Mizoram within September. Reacting to the notification, the president of Mizoram Br Displaced Peoples Coordination Committee Mizoram Br Displaced Peoples Coordination Committee (MBDPCO), Laldiliniiana, said he was aware of the government's decision. "We are aware of this.

We shall convene a meeting tomorrow with all refugees who are still here in Tripura and decide about our next course of action," he said.

Laldiliniiana also said the refugee body is contemplating writing to President Ram Nath Kovind, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh, the National Human Rights Commission National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) and other authorities. The MHA notification, he said, was issued to Mizoram from six relief camps in Kanchanpur and Panisagar sub-

divisions in North Tripura district. However, over 32,000 refugees are still sheltered in relief camps in the state. The repatriation process had started on August 25 and concluded on September 25 this year. Thousands of Brus had been lodged in the Tripura relief camps since late 1997 in the wake of a communal tension triggered by the brutal killing of Lalzawmlia, a forest guard, inside the Dampa Tiger Reserve on October 21, 1997, by Bru National Liberation Front Br National Liberation Front (BNLF) militants. KOLKATA, SEPT 30 /-/ Indian Railways has embarked on a mega transformation journey to create world class railway stations through station re development programme for Asansol station. The completed works include:

1. Circulating area extension and beautification. Area increased from 40 thousand square feet to 56 thousand square feet. Four landscaped gardens and lush lawns developed. 2. Stream lining of traffic, signages, drop zones and extended parking slots for various vehicles. 3. Illumination of station building with diffused lighting to accentuate its heritage and elegance. 4. Construction of paid premium air conditioned lounge with plush sofa and television. 5. Granite tiling of entrance and central location in platforms. 6. Improvement of platform surface by replacing broken kota stones and fitting of tactile. 7. Construction of toilets for Divyangs and thorough renovation of all existing platform toilets. 8.

Construction of two toilet complex in approach road to circulating area. 9. Construction of washable aprons at line no 3 and 5. 10. Provision of escalators in platforms.

11. Construction of heritage art gallery at platform no.2 and art works and wall paintings in various platforms and circulating area approach road.

Various other works for redevelopment including Renovation of Bus stand, Construction of Yatri Niwas, Granite flooring, Additional toilet complex, Renovation of all toilets, Retiring room complex of 05 rooms. Repair of damaged platform surfaces and drainage at all PPs. Additional POF connecting all 07 Platforms etc are in progress at Asansol. In Eastern Railway, a total number of 15 stations have been planned to be developed in planned manner over four Divisions of ER. These are Asansol, Durgapur, Jasidih, Madhubpur, Bandal Jn, Barddhaman, Howrah, Rampurbar, Bhagalpur, Jamalpur, Malda Town, New Farakka, Kolkata terminal, Naihati and Sealdah.

PATNA, SEPT 30 /-/ A 15-year-boy was kidnapped and stabbled to death here allegedly by three of his friends reportedly for harassing the girlfriend of one of them. The police on Saturday arrested the three youths in connection with the incidents of kidnapping and murder. City Superintendent of Police (West) Ravindra Kumar said Satyam, a student of class 10, was kidnapped three days ago and his body was found in a bush near the residence where the tiger prides live in Odisha. On Saturday, the Centre said that the state had 28 Royal Bengal Tigers, while the Odisha government claimed to be home to 40 RBTs and 318 leopards. The tiger census report of the state government was also rejected by the NTCA, which had put the number of big cats at 28. (PTI)

**Organ donated at Medica Superspecialty Hospital****EOIC CORRESPONDENT**

KOLKATA, SEPT 30 /-/ Champi Naskar, (a 47-year-old lady), a hypertensive and chronic kidney disease patient on maintenance haemodialysis was admitted to Medica. She was complaining of drowsiness and convulsion. She was diagnosed with massive intracerebral hemorrhage (ICH) with intraventricular hemorrhage (IVH). In such a situation considering her massive bleeding and poor Glasgow Coma Scale (GCS), operative intervention was ruled out. She continued to remain on conservative management. On detailed diagnosis, she was found to have no brain stem reflexes, confirmed by the brain death committee of Medica. Medica declared the brain death of the patient after second attempt. Following this, the patient's relatives were counselled for organ donation. The woman's husband, Swapna Kumar Naskar, agreed to donate her heart and liver. Regional Organ and Tissue Transplant Organisation (ROTO) authorities were duly informed regarding the same, immediately. As a result, the apex organisation that carries out organ and tissue transplant in the

region, informed us back saying that the heart and Liver of the patient had successfully allocated to one of the Private Hospitals on E M Bypass. Only the liver was retrieved. The heart was not fit for harvesting. "Medica will always extend its sincere support to organ transplantation initiative. We are glad that hospitals in Kolkata have performed as a cohesive unit with a collective clinical outcome. Our own transplant program is expected to start in the near future. Our respect and gratitude to the family for their act of their ultimate humanitarian gesture. May our faith in Kolkata and its people be blessed," said Dr. Kunal Sarkar, Senior Vice Chairman & Cardiac Surgeon, Medica Superspecialty Hospital. "No doubt, this is indeed a great cause. We hope that such a noble initiative can help in creating mass awareness in organ donation.
