PORT BLAIR, MAY 30/--/ One of the oldest and reli-able institutions of the coun-try, India Post, employs lakhs of people across the nation with presence even in the remotest of places with a strong network of more than 1.5 lakh post offices. Its sheer size became its biggest sheer size became its biggest strength, thanks to the e-commerce boom and wel-fare payments system through banks and post of-fices which helped the rev-enues of India Post. But the backbone of India's com-munication network for the past 150 years is drawing sharp criticism from custom-ers in this remote territory ers in this remote territory. Excessive delay in delivery of speed post articles and other consignments has in-vited the ire of even the top brass of the local admir

brass of the local administration for the agency. But the Andaman and Nicobar Postal Circle is geared up to better services under PM's Digital India push despire local challenges.

CBSE class XII exam results declared. Island percentage up by 6.98

PORT BLAIR, MAY 30/--/The results of All India Sr. School Certificate Examina-tion 2016-17 have been announced on May 28.

Though the official intimation is still downloaded from the website of CBSE, out of 4458 students who appeared in Class XII from Govt. Schools/Govt. aided & unaided

schools in A & N Islands -3503 students have passed and 729 students have been placed in Compartmental category. The overall pass percentage of A & N Islands stands at 78.58% as compared to 71.59% during 2015-16 which is an increase of 6.98%.
