

NE insurgency likely to increase
after Doklam: Ex-Army officer

KOLKATA, JAN 29 /-/- In Chinese hands it is likely to increase in the North East (NE) after the Doklam stand-off with China and there are already signs of it in the region. Former GOI-in-C East-ern Command Lt Gen J R Mukherjee said here today.

Whenever India has an annoyed China or there has been a border related issue between the two countries, it (China) has made insurances in the NE, Mukherjee told newsmen here commenting on the possible fall-out of the 74-day stand-off with the Chinese at Doklam in the

Sikkim sector. "Consequent to Doklam, insurgency will increase in the NE and signs of these are already evident," the retired Lt General, who is the vice-president (operations) of strategic think tank CENERS-K, said. Mukherjee said that Doklam is neither the first time nor the last that China has made such an attempt. Its army will keep coming and camp at places of that country's strategic interest.

"In Doklam, the China will eventually try to twist the Bhutanese state to get what they want," he said and claimed that V K Singh and will delve on issues ranging from political, economic and military capabilities to problems and prospecting to bilateral investments.

Professor Guo Xutang, director of Institute of International Strategy and Policy Analysis, Shanghai University of International Business and Economics, will be the lone Chinese speaker at the event, which is also scheduled to be attended by US and Japanese diplomats. (PTI)

11 political parties in Nagaland not to contest Assembly polls

KOHLIMA, JAN 29 /-/- In a major development in poll-bound Nagaland, 11 parties including the ruling Naga People's Front today decided not to contest the February 27 elections, agreeing to the demand of tribal bodies and civil society groups to resolve the protracted Nagaland political problem. The decision came at a meeting called by the core committee of Nagaland Tribal Hobos and Civil Organisations (CNTHCO) and attended by representatives of 11 parties. It is the unanimous view of the Nagaland people that the political solution or Naga peace accord is more important than elections and therefore, it has become imperative that the elections to the legislative Assembly of Nagaland be postponed till peace and tranquillity, read a joint declaration signed by the parties.

Tripura polls: CM, Cabinet ministers file nominations

AGARTALA, JAN 29 /-/- Chief Minister Manik Sarkar and his four Cabinet colleagues filed their nominations today for the ensuing Assembly elections. Tripura is set to go to polls on February 18 and the results for all 60 Assembly constituencies of the state will be announced on March 3. Sarkar will contest the election from his home turf Dhanpur in Sipsong district. Tripura education minister Tapan Chakraborty filed his documents from Chandipur constituency in North Tripura district. Besides Sarkar and his cabinet ministers, at least 20 MLAs of the ruling Left Front filed their nominations today from different parts of the state. Earlier, PWD minister Badal Choudhury had submitted his papers from Hrishyamukh constituency in South Tripura district. The last date for filing nominations in the state is January 31. (PTI)

IPFT women's wing to field 20 candidates

AGARTALA, JAN 29 /-/- The women's wing of the Indigenous People's Front of Tripura (IPFT) has decided to nominate women candidates in all the 20 reserved seats reserved for Scheduled Tribes in the state to protest against its parent body's move to field only male nominees. According to the terms of the alliance, the IPFT would contest nine seats reserved for Scheduled Tribes. The BJP would field candidates in the remaining 51 seats. Former Chhattisgarh, Tripura Gov D N Sahay passes away

PATNA, JAN 29 /-/- Former governor of Chhattisgarh and Tripura Devesh Nandan Sahay died here after prolonged illness, family sources said today. He is 92. He is survived by a son and two daughters. He breathed his last at a private hospital late last night, the sources said. Born in 1936, Sahay began his career with the Indian Police Service and rose to the position of the DGP of Bihar. After retirement, he had joined the Samata Party and became the first Governor of Chhattisgarh after the state was carved out of Madhya Pradesh in 2000. In 2003, Sahay took over as the Governor of Tripura and held the post till 2009. Condoling the death, Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar described Sahay as "an efficient political figure and police officer and a dedicated social worker". Kumar also visited Sahay's residence here and consoled the bereaved family members. (PTI)
