

Ceasework ends, Calcutta HC lawyers resume work

KOLKATA, APRIL 30 /- The lawyers' strike at the Calcutta High Court ended today after 70 days of cease-work, the longest in the history of the state's highest judiciary.

Three lawyers' associations had called for the cease-work on February 19, demanding immediate filling up of the vacant posts of judges at the high court to expedite the disposal of pending cases.

The corridors of the court were abuzz this morning as hundreds of lawyers and litigants attended the

hearings after the prolonged agitation that had affected the justice delivery system in West Bengal. A total number of 23,921 cases were pending before the court at the end of March this year, according to official data.

The Bar Association, which commands the affiliation of most of the lawyers practising in the high court, called off the cease-work on Saturday, a day after the Centre cleared the appointment of four judges and the chief justice to

the court. Justice Jyotirmoy Bhattacharya will take oath as the Chief Justice tomorrow, the office of the Registrar General said.

The high court was headed by acting chief justices for over three years, with the exception of three months in between. Bar Association president Uttam Majumdar said.

The court has a sanctioned strength of 72 judges, of which 42 posts were vacant when the agitation commenced in February.

Three advocates took oath on March 12, raising the strength of sitting judges to 33. The lawyers, however, had extended their strike, seeking recruitment in at least 50 per cent of the sanctioned seats.

The Bar Library Club and the Incorporated Law Society have also withdrawn the agitation and resumed work today. In 2002, the lawyers had resorted to a strike for two months to protest a hike in the stamp duty by the West Bengal government. (PTI)

Four youths held in Bihar for molesting girl

PATNA, APRIL 30 /- Four youths, including a minor, were arrested in Bihar's Jehanabad district in connection with the alleged molestation of a girl, after a video of the incident went viral on social media, a top police official said here today.

Inspector General of Police, Patna Zone, N H Khan, told reporters here that the police had received information late on Saturday night about the horrifying video in which some youths were seen molesting the girl, believed to be a minor, who kept crying for help.

A motorcycle was spotted in the clip. Its number was noted down and with its help the police got the vital clue that the incident had taken place in Jehanabad. An FIR was lodged at Town Police Station of Jehanabad on Sunday under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code and POCSO by additional sub-inspector S S Singh. The motorcycle, whose owner was absconding, was seized, he said.

A Special Investigating Team, comprising the superintendent of police of Jehanabad and an additional superintendent of police of Patna was set up and raids were conducted in Patna, Gaya and Jehanabad on the basis of the information obtained by the police, Khan said. He said Amar Kumar, Deepak Kumar and Sunil Kumar - all aged 18 years - and a juvenile have so far been arrested.

All of them belonged to Bharathua village under Koko Police Station area of Jehanabad. Two of them were seen in the video clip while the other two were involved in shooting the video. The police said during investigation, the youths confessed to their involvement and that they were joined by 4-5 other youths, who would be nabbed soon. The mobile phone, on which the video had been shot, was recovered from Amar Kumar, the IGP said. "The victim is yet to be identified though we have appealed to locals in Jehanabad to come forward and help the police with whatever information they have. The identity of the girl will be kept secret," Khan said. (PTI)

Six held by CBI in kidnapping, killing of a minor girl

MUZAFFARPUR, APRIL 30 /- Six people have been arrested by the CBI and sent to jail by a court here in connection with the kidnapping and killing of a 12-year-old girl, a CBI counsel said today.

The accused, Shah Alam Shabbu, Vikram Shukla, Brajesh Singh, Rajesh Kumar, Vimal Agrawal and Abhay Gupta, were arrested by the agency on Saturday night at its state headquarters in Patna where it had summoned them for interrogation, CBI leader H A Khan said. The accused were produced on Sunday before Special CBI Judge Amit Kumar Dixit at his residence who remanded them to 14 days' judicial custody, he said. The girl had gone missing from her house in Jawaharlal Road here in September, 2012. She had been kidnapped after the accused cut the window grill of her room.

Following the incident, the state witnessed a huge outcry and the Nitish Kumar-led ministry recommended a CBI probe following a request by the girl's parents in September, 2013. The agency began investigating in February, 2014 upon a direction from the Supreme Court. The CBI later recovered a skeleton from a ditch close to her residence and DNA tests confirmed that it was of the girl. (PTI)

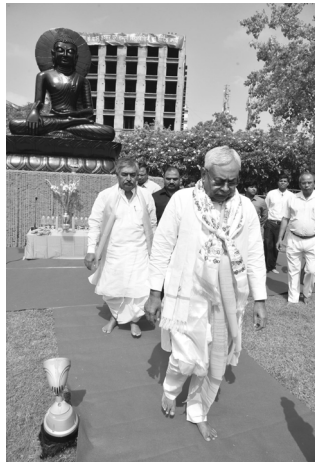
Naveen promises stringent action against Salipur rape accused

BHUBANESWAR, APRIL 30 /- Odisha chief minister Naveen Patnaik today assured stringent action against the accused in the rape case of a minor girl in Salipur, a day after the victim succumbed to injuries at a hospital in Cuttack.

Patnaik expressed his grief and shock over the death of the Salipur rape victim while making a statement in the Assembly here. "I will see to it that stringent action is taken against the accused. Rs 5 lakh has been given to the next of kin of the victim," Patnaik said.

The six-year-old girl was allegedly raped on the night of April 21 and the accused was arrested within 24 hours of this terrible incident. Patnaik said. The child was given the best medical attention by a team of doctors at SCB Medical College and Hospital in Cuttack, the chief minister said. Unfortunately, she died last night, he said.

"I would like to send my deepest condolence to the bereaved family and again I repeat, I feel deep anguish at this terrible incident," Patnaik said. The victim, battling for life a week, breathed her last at midnight yesterday, despite efforts by a 13-member team of doctors to save her. The girl was resuscitated in a critical condition from a street that led to a school under the jurisdiction of Salipur police station on April 22. She had deep injuries on her head, face, neck and on her private parts. Initially she was rushed to the Community Health Centre (CHC) at Salipur and was later shifted to SCB Medical College and Hospital since her condition deteriorated. Police have arrested a person under different sections of the IPC and the POCSO Act. "Since the victim has died, the attempt to murder charge will be converted to murder charge," the inspector of Salipur police station, D K Mallick, said. (PTI)

Chamling pips Jyoti Basu to become India's longest serving CM

GANGTOK, APRIL 30 /- Sikkim's Pawan Chamling has set a new record in the country by becoming the longest serving chief minister of a state, a title that Jyoti Basu, the former CPM patriarch of West Bengal, had held so far.

The founding president of the ruling Sikkim Democratic Front (SDF) completed 23 years, four months and 17 days of uninterrupted service in office on Sunday, exceeding Basu's tenure. The 68-year-old was sworn in as the chief minister of Sikkim for the first time on December 12, 1994. Born on September 22, 1950, at Yangang, South Sikkim, to Asha Rani Chamling and Lt. Ash Bahadur, Pawan Chamling dropped out of school after matriculation. He started his political career at the age of 32. Pawan Chamling served as the minister for industries, information and public relations from 1989 to 1992 in the Nar Bahadur Bhandari cabinet. After a series of political upheavals in Sikkim, he formed the SDF in 1993. Addressing a press conference on Sunday at Mintokgang, the official residence of the chief minister, Pawan Chamling said, "I am at the disposal of the people of my state. If they want me to take rest, I am okay with it and if they want me to serve Sikkim, I will continue. I do not have my own agenda." People in huge numbers turned up at his residence on Sunday to cheer for him. "I am grateful to everyone who reposed faith in me in every phase of my life," he said. The Sikkim chief minister also paid his homage to Jyoti Basu on this occasion and said he was fortunate to have surpassed the former West Bengal chief minister's record. Basu, the five-term West Bengal chief minister, had been in power from June 21, 1977 to November 6, 2000. He handed over the baton to Buddhadeb Bhattacharjee in 2000, citing health reasons. Basu passed away in 2010 at the age of 85. (PTI)

Nitish urges PM to confer Bharat Ratna on Lohia

PATNA, APRIL 30 /- Bihar chief minister Nitish Kumar on Sunday urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi to confer the 'Bharat Ratna', the highest civilian award in the country, on socialist leader Ram Manohar Lohia. In a three-page letter addressed to the Prime Minister, Kumar drew Modi's attention towards Lohia's role in the struggle for independence, his efforts in bringing together non-Congress parties during the time of Nehru, his model of socialism rooted in Indian realities and his emphasis on issues of public sanitation and women's upliftment decades ago.

The chief minister also highlighted Lohia's active participation in the movement for Goa's liberation from Portuguese rule and suggested that the international airport in the coastal state be named after him. "Lohia had gone to the extent of saying that he would give up opposing Nehru if the latter got toilets constructed for rural women. His foresight can also be gauged from his emphasis on equipping kitchens with chimneys so that smoke did not spoil women's health," Kumar said in the letter. "In the light of these facts, it would be appropriate that the Government of India confer Bharat Ratna on Lohia, in the honour of his contributions, on his death anniversary on October 12, 2018 and also rename the Goa International Airport as Dr Ram Manohar Lohia Airport," he said. Parl panel to visit border areas of Sikkim, Arunachal

NEW DELHI, APRIL 30 /- The Parliamentary Standing Committee on External Affairs, headed by Congress MP Shashi Tharoor and including Rahul Gandhi, will visit border areas in Sikkim and Arunachal Pradesh next month to take stock of the situation following the Doklam crisis with China, sources said.

The panel has been looking into various aspects of the India-China military standoff at Doklam and has been briefed several times on the issue by the former and current foreign secretary Vijay Gokhale. The panel will visit the border areas in two states - Sikkim and Arunachal Pradesh to see the ground realities and take stock of the situation on border in the two states, a source said.

The idea is to get a firsthand experience of the situation on the India-China border in the two states and, if possible, visit areas where incursions have happened, another source said. The panel, which may also use a chopper to get an aerial view, could also interact with top security and defence officials deployed there, sources said.

Troops of India and China were locked in a 73-day standoff in Doklam in Sikkim sector from June 16 to August 16, 2017. India stopped the building of a road in the disputed tri-junction by the Chinese Army. Bhutan and China military standoffs at Doklam. Earlier, foreign ministry officials had informed the 31-member parliamentary panel that Bhutan was firmly with India on the issue.

During the discussions, Congress president Gandhi questioned foreign ministry officials on China's objections to India's plan to build a road in Doklam to create a confrontation, sources had said. Gandhi had also asked about reports of a major Chinese building near Doklam, to which officials replied that nothing had been done in Indian territory. (PTI)

Meghalaya DG gets 3-month extension

SHILLONG, APRIL 30 /- Meghalaya Director General (DG) of police S B Singh was granted a three-month extension of services after his superannuation day today, officials said here. Singh, an 1986 batch IPS officer of Assam Meghalaya cadre, was appointed the DG last year. "The ministry of home affairs has conveyed the extension of his service today and it was faxed to the chief secretary," a senior government official told PTI, requesting anonymity. The Meghalaya Democratic Alliance government in the state had sought extension of Singh's service as the meeting for the State Security Commission was delayed, sources said. The State Security Commission decides on who will be the fittest among the top five senior IPS officers to head the state police. The delay was caused as one of the judicial members declined to accept his membership at the last moment. (PTI)

CRPF jawan kills self inside camp

TEZPUR, APRIL 30 /- A CRPF jawan today allegedly committed suicide by shooting himself with his service rifle at the force's Chariduar camp here in Assam's Sonitpur district, police said.

The jawan, identified as Pradeep Kumar Sen, shot himself with his AK-56 rifle at the camp this morning, additional superintendent of police Nunal Mahatta said. Preliminary investigations indicate it to be a case of suicide and why he has done this is being ascertained, he told PTI.

The body of Sen, who hailed from South Tripura, was sent for post mortem examination at Kamolika Civil Hospital here and was later handed over to the CRPF authorities, Mahatta added. (PTI)

Arms smuggler held

MUNGER, APRIL 30 /- The police have arrested a man, a suspected arms smuggler, along with arms and ammunition during a raid in Bihar's Munger district. The man was arrested from Ganga ghāt near Taurif village yesterday, a police officer said.

The police seized six automatic pistols and 12 magazines from the man, the Additional Superintendent of Police (ASP) of Munger district, Hari Shankar Kumar, said. The man was sent to jail today after preliminary interrogation, the ASP said.

The man had bought six automatic pistols and 12 magazines from a village called Bardaha and he was supposed to transport the weapons to other side of the river Ganges midnight last night, the ASP said. (PTI)

Kolkata Metro to run 224 services on May Day

KOLKATA, APRIL 30 /- On account of May Day most offices and schools will remain closed, Metro Railway, Kolkata has decided to run 224 services today instead of 300 services as run on weekdays. (EOIC)

Man found hanging from tree, IPL links suspected

JAMSHEDPUR, APRIL 30 /- A 26-year-old man was found hanging from a tree at Birsanagar area and the police suspect that he had links with an Indian Premier League (IPL) cricket betting racket. The body of Sandeep Ram, a cook of a fast food stall at Plaza Market in Telco, was found hanging from a tree, a short distance away from his rented house at Birsanagar area on Sunday, the police said. "We are investigating the matter thoroughly as the victim had made some calls to his friends on Saturday night, and he was allegedly involved in the betting of IPL," a police officer-in-charge of Birsanagar police station, Upendra Narayan Singh said. Filmmaker seeks Mamata's help for screening movie on 1946 riots

KOLKATA, APRIL 30 /- Director Milan Bhowmik has written to West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee, urging her to take "immediate steps" to ensure that his film 'Danga', based on 1946 riots in Calcutta, is released in theatres across the state.

The film, which has actor Gajendra Chauhan in the role of Jan Sangh founder Syama Prasad Mookerjee, was scheduled to release in 37 theatres in West Bengal on April 27, but only two movie halls have agreed to screen it so far, Bhowmik said here today.

"I have mailed letters to the offices of the Chief Minister and the chief secretary on April 27 and received a confirmation about the delivery. I am yet to get a reply to my letters," he explained. It is said that a film that has been awarded a U/A certificate by the Central Board of Film Certification did not get a proper release in the state, Bhowmik rued. "I am now hoping the state government intervenes into the matter to ensure that the film gets screen time in the stipulated theatres," he said.

The Hindi version of 'Danga' is running successfully in theatres of Assam, Bihar and Jharkhand, Bhowmik said. "The film is doing well in other states. I am facing problems only in Bengal."

Hinting at sabotage attempts, Bhowmik said the 35 hall owners, who have cancelled shows, must have faced threats of some kind. "I guess the theatre owners were threatened by people with vested interests," he said, adding that he would be compelled to move high court if the film does not find screen space in West Bengal.

"I have mentioned in the letter that the film does not promote hatred, it instead it advocates communal brotherhood. I think I was able to explain this to the CBFC. We did not speak in favour of any political group in the film," he added. (PTI)
