**ANUP JAYSWAL** NORTH DINAJPUR, OCT 11//—A team of National Human Rights Commission led by DG Chhaya Sharma visited Daribhit village under Islampur police station today where two students were shot dead on September 20. The delegation would be speaking to different persons and officials during their stay in the district up to October 14.

The members of the delegation sought the views of the family members of two deceased students - Rajesh Sarkar and Tapas Barman. They also spoke to the students of the high school and other residents of the village. However, no member of the delegation liked to speak to media when asked about their primary finding. It may be mentioned that

the family members of deceased students knocked the doors of the national human right commission to look into the deaths of Sarkar and Barman. Meanwhile, CPI-ML leadership demanded a judicial probe into deaths of two students by a sitting judge. Abhijit Majumdar, a CPI-ML leader said, "CID is influenced by the state government and CBI is influenced by the central government. So, we do not believe that either of the investigation agencies would be able to furnish an impartial report about deaths of students. Hence, we want judicial probe into the matter," Majumdar said.

Meanwhile, Daribhit high school remained closed today also as the locals including mothers of dead students resisted opening of school before a CBI probe was ordered.

Fifty lakh girls empowered by Kanyashree scheme, says Mamata

KOLKATA, OCT 11//—More than 50 lakh girls of West Bengal have been empowered by the Kanyashree scheme of the state government, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee said on Thursday. Mamata took to the Twitter on International Day of the Girl Child to state that her government has allocated a budget of Rs 6600 crore for the scheme.

Kanyashree is a conditional cash transfer scheme aiming at improving the status and well-being of the girl child by incentivising schooling of teenage girls and delaying their marriages until the age of 18. "More than 50 lakh girls have been empowered through this scheme which has a budget of Rs 6600 crore," she said on her Twitter handle. Kanyashree scheme was launched in 2011 under the leadership of late PM Manmohan Singh to empower girls in West Bengal topping the 34-year rule of the Left Front government. On the International Day of the Girl Child, she said, "I am happy to share that our #Kanyashree Pralakra for girl child had been feted by the @UN in 2017." The scheme received the United Nations Public Service Award last year.

DRI arrests three men with gold, silver worth crores of rupees

KOLKATA, OCT 11//—The Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) has arrested three men and seized from them gold and silver worth crores of rupees, believed to have been smuggled into the country from neighbouring Nepal, according to an official statement issued Thursday. Acting on inputs, DRI officials searched two residential premises in Howrah and 9.091 kg of gold of foreign origin valued at Rs 2.87 crore and 14 kg of silver of foreign origin, worth Rs 4.2 lakh, were recovered, it said.

On further follow up action, the officials conducted searches at a shop and recovered another 3.8 kg of silver granules of foreign origin valued at Rs 1.14 lakh and nearly 46 grams gold of foreign origin, worth Rs 1.45 lakh, along with Rs 1.12 crore in cash. Three men were arrested in these searches conducted on Tuesday and Wednesday, the DRI said in a statement. These three men could not produce any licit documents of import and for possession of gold, silver and foreign currency notes amounting to Rs 1.12 crore, it said.
