

Anex court asks Sikkim govt to maintain status quo at Gurudwara Gurudongmar

Petitioner told to approach HC

NEW DELHI, AUG 30 /- The Supreme Court today asked the Sikkim government to maintain "status quo" at the historic Gurudwara Gurudongmar in the state.

The order came on a plea seeking a direction to restrain the state government from demolishing the religious structure allegedly in the name of renovation. A bench headed by Chief Justice Dipak Misra disposed of the petition after the counsel appearing for the state government said that a similar plea was pending before the High Court, which would come up for hearing on September 13. The apex court then

asked the petitioner to approach the High Court but ordered status quo till the matter was heard by the High Court.

"We permit the applicant to be implemented before the High Court. Be it noted, we have not expressed any opinion on the merits of the matter," the High Court is free to decide the same in accordance with the law," the bench, also comprising Justices Amitava Roy and A M Khanwilkar. Said the petitioner, Amritpal Singh Khalsa, had moved the apex court alleging that the state authorities have illegally removed the holy book, Guru Granth Sahib, from the site and would demolish

the gurdwara in the name of renovation. Khalsa had said the petition was filed in extreme urgency due to the threat of demolition or renovation of Gurudwara Gurudongmar. The bench had on Tuesday asked him to serve the copy of the plea to the standing counsel of the state during the course of the day.

Khalsa had alleged that state authorities have illegally removed the holy book from the gurdwara without following any code of conduct on the pretext of renovation. He had claimed there was an "imminent threat" of the gurdwara being demolished without prior intimation to the Sikh

priest there. The plea had claimed that there were several historic books and documents which indicated that Guru Nanak Ji, the first Guru of the Sikhs, had gone to the gurdwara Gurudongmar.

It had sought the apex court's direction prohibiting the authorities from carrying out any demolition or renovation work at the site. The plea had also said if the authorities wished to carry out any renovation work at the site, a prior notice of one month should be given to the priest so that appropriate action to shift the Guru Granth Sahib as per the Sikh code of conduct could be taken.

Patna HC upholds life term of Shahabuddin in Siwan murder case

PATNA, AUG 30 /- The Patna High Court today upheld the life sentence of former BJP lawmaker Mohammad Shahabuddin in connection with the 2004 Siwan acid attack case. Three brothers - Rajiv, Satish and Girsh - sons of a businessman, were killed on August 16, 2004. Satish and Girsh were drenched in acid before being killed, while Rajiv was injured during his ride back home on a motorcycle. Earlier on August 22, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) had filed a charge sheet against Shahabuddin in the murder case of Siwan-based journalist Rajdeo Ranjan. Rajdeo was shot down in Siwan as he was returning from office on May 13, 2016.

Tibetan Rehabilitation Policy will not affect Arunachalees: BJP

ITANAGAR, AUG 30 /- Amid growing protests in Arunachal Pradesh against the recent decision by the cabinet to implement the Tibetan Rehabilitation Policy, 2014, the ruling BJP today said that the policy will not affect Arunachalees. "The Tibetans are not claiming any citizenship but staying in three settlements in the state in an organized way unlike the Chakma and Hajong refugees," state BJP president Taperi Gao said during an interaction with the media here. Gao said the state government has no separate policy on the Tibetans but is following the central policy which is mandatory as India is a signatory to the Geneva Agreement. "The Rehabilitation Policy was framed during 1959 when the Dalai Lama fled Tibet and took political asylum in India. The policy which is being reviewed every 20

years is not an act so far. Since we respect human rights, we are obliged to follow the policy," he said. Several organisations like All Arunachal Pradesh Students Union, Arunachal Pradesh Congress Committee and Peoples Party of Arunachal have protested against the decision of the state cabinet to implement the policy in the state as well as its rollback. The decision, they claimed, would badly affect the indigenous tribal population of the state especially in jobs and other facilities from state as well as Central schemes. As per the 2009 census, a total of 1,10,095 Tibetans are present in the state, settled in 45 settlements in ten states. There are six settlements in Karnataka, one each in Maharashtra, Odisha and Chattisgarh, three in Arunachal Pradesh, two in Sikkim, two in West Bengal, four in Uttarakhand, 16 in Himachal Pradesh and nine in Jammu and Kashmir. The BJP leader informed that out of the 7,530 Tibetans settled in three settlements in Arunachal Pradesh, 935 have been rehabilitated in Canada last year. "As per the Rehabilitation Policy, the Central Tibetan Administration (CTA) conducts census of the Tibetan refugees every five years and submit report to the Centre as well as the respective state governments," Gao said.

The BJP leader said the Centre found that the level of assistance and facilities extended by various state governments to the Tibetans were not uniform. The Rehabilitation Policy, 2014 was framed to provide a uniform guideline demarcating the facilities to be extended to the Tibetan refugees living within the jurisdiction of each state government. As per the policy, the state government should necessarily sign a lease document for the land owned by the Tibetans for a period of 20 years or till it is revoked or cancelled. Moreover, Rent Tenancy Certificate should be issued by the respective state governments and land under their occupation should not be disturbed.

Gao said, the state government has been advised by the Centre to extend state government as well as central schemes such as MNRGS, PDS, NFSA, IAY, NRLM, RAY and NRMH, besides infrastructural facilities and basic amenities like roads, electrification, drinking water and medical facilities in and around the settlement. The state government had also been advised to permit qualified professionals amongst the Tibetans to pursue jobs in private and non-government sectors in any field.

Assam CM agrees for micro minority status to Sikhs

GUWAHATI, AUG 30 /- In response to the demand of Assamese Sikhs, the state government on Tuesday reportedly agreed to accord "micro minority status" to the community. A delegation of Delhi Sikh Gurudwara Management Committee (DSCMC) and representatives of the Assamese Sikhs led by Committee General secretary Manjinder Singh Sirsam Assam chief minister Sarbananda Sonowal on Tuesday in this regard. "The chief minister agreed to accord micro minority status to the Assamese Sikh community in the state and provide various facilities for socio-economic and political upliftment of the community," Sirsam said while addressing a press conference in Guwahati.

According to him, the Assam government had responded towards their various demands and that the government had also appointed an officer of the state as the nodal officer to coordinate implementation of these demands. "The Assam chief minister has also agreed to implement Anand Marriage Act in the state at the earliest, start service to enable the Sikh community members have darshan of Sri Durga Mata and other Gurudwaras in the state and also sanctioned an amount of Rs 5 crore for Building Community Centre and Education Complex in Nagaon," he added. Sonowal also agreed to install a statue of General Chetanya Singh, the first Sikh soldier who was sent to Assam with a platoon of 500 Sikh soldiers from Punjab by the British Army to come to be known as Assamese Sikhs. As the history goes, then Ahom King Chandrakanta Singha had sought the help of Maharaja Ranjit Singh in 1820 when the Burmese attacked the kingdom. The war continued for two years and the Sikh soldiers who survived the war settled in Assam and came to be known as Assamese Sikhs. Although these Assamese Sikhs are devout Sikhs and sport turban, they have got assimilated in the Assamese culture and most of them do not even know the Punjabi language.

Dera Sacha Sauda found to have encroached govt land in Puri

BHUBANESWAR, AUG 30 /- Gurmeet Ram Rahim Singh's Dera Sacha Sauda ashram in Puri is found to have encroached about 12 decimal of government land in Puri-Konark marine drive area, official said on Monday. A five-member team of revenue department officials headed by the local tehsildar measured the ashram land and found the irregularities today. The land measurement exercise was undertaken following an order of state revenue minister Maheshwari Mohanty based on the complaint of local people about the encroachment of government land by the ashram. "A notice for eviction will be issued to the ashram by the local tehsildar. We will get back the encroached land soon," Puri sub-collector Madhu Sudan Das told newspersons. Sources said Dera Sacha Sauda had purchased four acres from a woman in 2004 and constructed ashram over it. Puri Sachchanta Nagarika Mancha had on Friday staged an agitation before the ashram and raised slogans against the violence by the Dera supporters in Haryana following Gurmeet Singh's conviction.

Medical College nurse dies due to 'negligence'

MIDNAPORE, AUG 30 /- A nurse working in the Midnapore Medical College and Hospital died here today due to 'negligence' by the authorities, following which other nurses lodged a police complaint and gheraoed the superintendent. The nurse, Tripti Dinda (27), was admitted to the hospital on Saturday with fever, and pain in spine. She was advised an MRI test but that could not be done as the MRI machine in the hospital was not functioning, the nurses alleged. After Dinda's death, the nurses lodged a police complaint that she died because of negligence by authorities.

Police said when they went to the hospital to take the body for postmortem, her family members refuse to hand over the body saying they did not want it. The family members took the body out of the hospital but the police approached them again at Bat Talia Chowk, a major crossing. An altercation followed and members of the hospital had started a road blockade preventing the body there, police said adding, after sometime they were allowed to go with the body without postmortem. The nurses then gheraoed hospital superintendent Tanmay Panja demanding improvement of infrastructure. Doctors of the hospital had been assaulted last night following death of a child and they also joined the nurses demanding security, hospital officials said. The gherao was lifted after Panja promised that steps would be taken to improve infrastructure and security measure, the officials said.

Pipe gun seized

MALDA, AUG 30 /- The police seized 10 pieces of improvised pipe gun from Kaliachak area of Malda district. According to police sources, the cops raided the house of Md Saikul Sheikh of Mojmempur under the jurisdiction of Kaliachak police station area last night and seized 10 pieces of improvised pipe gun.

Bengal PCB to equip police patrol teams to fight sound pollution

KOLKATA, AUG 30 /- The West Bengal Pollution Control Board (WBPCB) will equip patrolling police teams in Kolkata and its neighbourhood areas with sound limiter devices this Tuesday to fight sound pollution.

"This is aimed at curbing sound pollution as we often hear from the cops about difficulties in measuring sound exceeding the specified 65 decibel limit at puja pandals and immersion processions," WBPCB chairman Kalyan Rudra told news agency PTI here today. Rudra said 720 sound limiter gadgets, which can immediately measure the sound level at a spot, would be handed over to Kolkata Police and Bidhannagar, Barrackpore police commissionerates. "The members of the police team will also be trained by WBPCB experts on how to handle the gadget," he said.
