

No KMC water for South Kolkata after 10 am on June 30

KOLKATA, JUNE 27 /- Supply of filtered water from Garden Reach Water Treatment Plant (TRWTP) was stopped because of interconnection of higher diameter water pipeline, installation of valves, leakage repairing and maintenance works. Supply of filtered water from the booster pumping stations at Kalighat, Rankin Road, Garfa, Behala, Sirsi, Dasgupta, Banskroni, Gandhi Maidan, Golf Green, Sen Pally, Pratula Park, Layekla, Chetla and Parnashree, including different headworks/small pumping stations of GRWW command zone will not be available on that day after 10 a.m. As a result, South Kolkata, including Behala, Garden Reach, Jadavpur, Tollygunge and areas under Borough-8 (part), Borough-9 (part), Borough-10, Borough-11, (part), Borough 12 (part), Borough-13, Borough-14, Borough-15 and Borough-16 (part) will not get filtered water after 10 a.m. on June 30, according to a communique released by KMC. Injured persons were admitted to block health centre. Congress leadership has claimed that six of the injured were Congress workers and accused Trinamool Congress for the attack on their party workers after they attended the public meeting addressed by leader of Opposition in state Assembly Abdul Mannan on June 22. Congress leaders alleged that Trinamool Congress backed goons led by Mohammed Abdul attacked Congress workers Lakshmi, Dangapara and other villages. Trinamool rubbished the allegation.

FICN seized

KOLKATA, JUNE 27 /- Kolkata Police has seized Fake Indian Currency Notes (FICN) with a face value of Rs five lakh, and arrested one person in this connection from Chandi Chowk area here, a senior officer said today. Acting on a phone call from a shopkeeper of an electronic goods store, a team of the Kolkata Police Special Task Force (STF) arrested the person last night, when he was trying to purchase items exchanging the FICN. Two hundred FICNs of the denomination of Rs 2,000 and Rs 500 were seized from the person's possession, the officer said. (EOIC)

Subrata appreciates compact project by Malda admin for water resources utilisation

KOLKATA/ MALDA, JUNE 27 /- Panchayat & rural development minister Subrata Mukherjee appreciated the comprehensive plan prepared by the district Panchayat & Rural Development (P&RD) officials at the behest of the District Magistrate (DM) Kaushik Bhattacharya for proper utilization of river-water in Malda.

Mukherjee met the district nodal officers of P&RD department in Kolkata on Wednesday to discuss projects and schemes to be implemented for large benefit of the people. Ajit Ranjan Barhain, principal secretary of the department, was also present in the meeting.

Sukanta Saha, District Panchayat and Rural Development Officer (DPRDO) of the department, presented the contour map and a unique compact scheme to connect canals, rivers and water-bodies so that the district could get rid of flood-threats and proper utilization of water for irrigation and other purposes

started planning for utilization of water-resources since then. River expert Prof Kalyan Rudra was invited to a seminar during Malda book fair where the matter was discussed at large. Workshops and other programmes were taken up by the district administrations to find the solution. It has been learnt from the sources that the project is likely to be complete in three years involving a huge human-resources that would expedite Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS) in the district. "The project was an initiative of DM, Malda who took all possible initiatives in this regard. It would be a joint effort and help would be obtained from the irrigation, environment and other concerned departments. Prof Rudra has also expressed content with scheme taken up at the encouragement of the district magistrate," Saha said. "The minister has expressed pleasure with the project after we briefly explained the utility of the project to him," the DPRDO said over phone. It has been learnt that along with the utilization of the water-resources available in the district, fishing and other related employments would be guaranteed during and after the implementation. Primarily Rs 70 crore has been estimated as the budget of the project which may be complete within Rs 100 crore as has been learnt from sources.

Four accidents take nine lives in a week at Malda

Crucial meeting held for road-safety

MALDA, JUNE 27 /- Profoundly concerned with alarming rise in road-accidents and number of casualties, the top brass of district police held a crucial meeting at district police headquarters on Wednesday. It has been decided that a special drive would be taken up to curb the road-accidents and to monitor the movement of vehicles.

It may be mentioned that five persons including four of a family were killed in a road-accident on NH-34 near toll-plaza under Baishnabnagar police station on June 26. A driver of a motorized-van was killed on NH-34 AT Kotubari area under Gazole police station on June 21. Another four persons including two women and a kid were killed in two separate accidents on Armitry-Kaliachak state highway at Turtipura area under Mothabari police station on June 20. Sources in the district police department said that it was found through analysis that in most cases driving at a break-neck speed, driving along wrong-lane, sudden stops on NH and driving two-wheelers without helmet were responsible for the accidents. Police officials also spotted some

high accident-prone zones. Most of the accidents occurred on NH-34 and the roads connected to the NH, a police official said. "Hence with an eye to curbing such offences the district police has decided to install flash-towers at regular gaps on NH-34. Police-personnel would be using binocular to observe the movements of the vehicles. In case of violation of rules, prompt information would be conveyed to local police stations or mobile-team that would apprehend the offending vehicles," the police official said. The manned watch-towers would be kept at a distance of 2 km. Additional CCTVs for round-the-clock surveillance would also be installed at accident-prone areas as has been learnt from the official. Superintendent of police Ansh Ghosh said, "It is unfortunate that lives were lost in few consecutive accidents in recent past. District police are committed to ensure road-safety. Traffic-rules violations would be treated with zero-tolerance." "A case has been registered under the dumper-304 of the IPC against the driver of the 304-ruled truck that collided with a sports utility vehicle while running on wrong-lane on Tuesday resulting in death of four persons," SP, Malda said.

Manipur varsity impasse continues

The academic activities of the Manipur University resumed suspended for the 28th day today following student agitation demanding removal of the Vice Chancellor Pradyota Prasad Pandey, university sources said. The agitation has been spearheaded by the Manipur University Students Union (MUSU) for the removal of the Vice Chancellor for his alleged failure to appoint members in important posts, lavish travelling and hampering academic functioning in the university, an MUSU member said. The Vice Chancellor of Central University had earlier dismissed the allegations and claimed that the student functionaries were connected to militant bodies. (PTI)

Baby girl tortured for refusing to steal

MALDA, JUNE 27 /- District child-line recently rescued a minor girl from Krishnakaitala area under English Bazaar police station who was allegedly forced by her mother to steal valuables from neighbours' quarters. The incident has started the residents of the town.

The accused mother's Srim (name changed) Dorji allegedly tortured the year-old daughter Sohini (name changed) when the kid refused to comply with her directions. According to sources in the police, the child-line officials were informed by local residents that the minor girl used to be brutally tortured. Child-line officials were surprised when they heard from the complainants that the girl used to be compelled by her mother to lift valuables from neighbours' houses in their absence. "The kid too replicated the version of the local residents. She informed that the articles she had stolen were kept at the custody of her mother. The minor girl has been kept with us safely," a child-line official said preferring anonymity. After police were informed by the child-line officials, police have started a probe, said Purnendu Kundu, inspector-in-charge, English Bazaar station. (PTI)

One dead, four hurt in two accidents in Siliguri

SILIGURI, JUNE 27 /- / One person was killed and four others injured in two separate road-accidents around the city on Wednesday. While the body of the deceased was sent for post-mortem, the injured were admitted to North Bengal Medical College & Hospital (NBMCCH). According to police sources, one Ganesh Sarkar was run over by a speeding lorry when he fell off a two-wheeler and returned having lost the balance near Kankata turning on eastern-metropolitan bypass in Siliguri. Siliguri metropolitan police started probe into the accidents. "Measures are being taken to lessen road-accidents," a police official said.
