

Kolkata turns into a drug hotspot during year-end parties: NCB

KOLKATA, DEC 25 /- In the last couple of years, Kolkata has evolved as one of the hotspots for drug peddlers during the year-end celebrations, with a rising demand for narcotics among party animals. The city hosts numerous parties and events during Christmas and New Year festivities and drug peddlers throng the hotspots to cater to the demands of party-hoppers, sleuths from the Narcotic Control Bureau (NCB) said.

"It is only recently that Kolkata is emerging as one of the top cities in India where banned drugs like hashish, LSD are sold during this time of the year. The demand for drugs rises in this period and several peddlers are seen flocking to the city to sell these narcotics," Dilip Kumar

Srivastava, zonal director, NCB, Kolkata, told PTI. According to him, drugs are also directly involved in selling the drugs to the purchasers," Srivastava said. Besides popular pubs, there are several bars in the city where drug peddlers have made a safe den for their business, another NCB official said. Incidentally, the NCB in Kolkata has arrested five persons, including a management student and a DJ with a popular band in the city, earlier this month for their alleged involvement in a drug racket. Around six to seven top schools in the city were asked to set up a mechanism by the NCB to keep a tab on students as drug smugglers often target vulnerable teenagers, Srivastava said.

Asked about the ways

and means people use to contact the peddlers, the zonal director said social media and chatting apps are used for the purpose. Facebook, Whatsapp and other communicating sites are often used to contact drug sellers and probable buyers, he explained. If you wish to procure it, you will manage anyway, he said.

The NCB will be on the look out for drug peddlers in the city this year and has alerted the Excise and the Kolkata Police in this connection. Last week, the Excise department with the help of the NCB had arrested two women from the city and seized consignments of Hashish from them. On enquiring about the actions initiated against drug peddlers, a senior officer of Kolkata Police said

Presidency Mentor Group to reach out to brilliant students

KOLKATA, DEC 25 /- Presidency Mentor Group chair professor Sugata Bose on Sunday said the group was exploring options to reach out to brilliant students in districts for bringing in the best brains to Presidency University Bose, the gardener professor of history at Harvard University, said they wanted to attract the best brains to Presidency University and the mentor group will intend to visit districts and reach out to meritorious students. "We must ensure the students come to know about the details regarding the subjects and courses on offer at Presidency. The modalities can be chalked out in due course," the Mentor Group Chair told reporters on the sidelines of the Convocation of Jadavpur University here. "We have to bring the talents," he said. Presidency Mentor Group had been set up by West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee to charter a roadmap for making Presidency University as a pre-eminent institution of learning in the world. Bose said the mentor group will make assessment on the overall situation in the industry, how

much progress had been made after 2011. "One thing I can say, there had been no political influence in any faculty recruitment since 2011-12 and everything had been done on purely academic merit," he commented.

Bose said while the best universities in the world are more flexible in allocating fund to retain the human resources, in India the varsities are bound by set rules by UGC. "While the Centre can allocate fund for brick and mortar, professors and assistant professors are paid as per UGC directives," he said hinting the situation should change. Bose said at a recent Higher Education Consultative Committee meeting in Delhi he had pointed out that all central and state universities should be given autonomy to enable them to reach excellence.

To a question about education minister Partha Chatterjee comment that the heritage structure of Presidency was tinkered with during renovation work, Bose said, the mentor group will talk to the minister as well as Alumni Association and university authorities on the issue. (PTI)

One killed, 15 hurt

BHAWANIPATNA, DEC 25 /- One person was killed and 15 others were seriously injured when a tractor carrying picnicers fell into a gorge in Kalahandi district on Sunday, police said. The tractor carrying around 40 people, including women and children from Disjagon village for a picnic, turned turtle after losing balance at a curve at Singarihat and fell into a gorge, they said. While a man, identified as Hemanta Majhi (26) of Dasigaon village, died in the mishap, at least 15 others sustained serious injuries, the police said. People from nearby Kalampur rescued the injured persons and shifted them to hospital. (PTI)

Jharkhand Cong to launch agitation

JAMSHEDPUR, DEC 25 /- The Congress on Sunday said it would launch an agitation to protest against the alleged deterioration in the law and order situation in Jharkhand. The agitation will either be launched in January or February next year, Jharkhand Pradesh Congress Committee (JPCC) president Dr Ajoy Kumar told reporters here. He alleged that lawlessness has been prevailing and corruption has been at its peak in the state under the Raghubar Das regime. The agitation has reached to such an extent that people are not even safe in court premises, alleged former JPCC chief Sukhdeo Bhagat referring to the gunning down of a contractor-cum-JMM leader in the premises of a local court, in the chief minister's home town here, a few months ago. Six militants held in Manipur

IMPHAL, DEC 25 /- Six militants, including a woman, belonging to different underground outfits, were arrested by security forces from different places in Manipur, police said on Sunday. The police arrested two active members of the proscribed Kangleipak Communist Party (KCP) from Heingang Bazaar area in Manipur's Imphal East district yesterday, a police statement said. Three other militants, including a woman, of the same outfit, were arrested after the two arrested militants disclosed their whereabouts during interrogation, the statement said. On Friday, the police arrested an active member of the banned underground outfit KCP (People's War Group) while carrying out frisking and checking at Pishum Bridge in Imphal West district, the statement added. Naveen greets ex-PM Vajpayee

BHUBANESWAR, DEC 25 /- Odisha chief minister Naveen Patnaik greeted former prime minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee on his 83rd birthday. "Warm greetings to former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee ji on his birthday. I pray to God for his good health and long life," Patnaik tweeted. Patnaik, who entered politics after the death of his father Biju Patnaik in 1997, was a union minister in the NDA ministry headed by Vajpayee. It was under the guidance of Vajpayee when Patnaik's regional outfit Biju Janata Dal (BJD) formed an alliance with BJP in Odisha. The BJD-BJP alliance ruled the state for about a decade from 2000 and broke just before 2009 general election. Despite the break of alliance with BJP, Patnaik is often known to visit Vajpayee and inquire about his health condition. (PTI)

Church vandalised by two drunken youths

SHILLONG, DEC 25 /- A church was vandalised on Christmas day today by two unidentified drunken youths in Tura town of Meghalaya, a senior police officer said. The incident was caught on CCTV camera and the Baptist Church in the Hawana area of Tura and it had also gone viral on social media with people condemning the incident which took place hours after the midnight service.

"Two youths in inebriated condition were seen breaking the glass entrance of the Church premises. The incident took place at around 2.15 am," West Garo Hills,

superintendent of police, R Kumar told PTI. He said the Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) will inquire into the incident. The SP said the church authorities have submitted the CCTV footages available. Analysing the footages, the SP said the two youths were clearly in an inebriated condition. Terminating it a drunken act, Kumar said it was unfortunate to have taken place on a Christmas day.

"It was not an act aimed at vandalising the property but a drunken act by two young people who were too drunk to handle themselves," the SP said. (PTI)

WB BJP leaders struggle to meet mass outreach target

KOLKATA, DEC 25 /- BJP leaders in West Bengal are struggling to meet a mass outreach target set by party chief Amit Shah ahead of the panchayat elections even as the party grapples with infighting and lack of coordination among the state BJP members.

A section of the BJP's central leadership believes that the party is making steady inroads into the TMC-ruled Bengal, once a stronghold of the Left Front, but owing to several reasons its state unit has not been able to capitalise on the wave fully.

The results of various elections that followed the 2016 assembly polls have shown a steep rise in party vote share and paved way for its emergence as the prime challenger to the ruling TMC in Bengal. Although the state BJP leadership received a pat on its back from none other than Prime Minister Narendra Modi yesterday for a significant rise in ballot share with 18 per cent votes, a senior leader admitted that the party still has a long way to go to woo its voters.

"We are yet to reach out to all 77,000 booths in the state. Our party president Amit Shah, during his visit to Bengal earlier this year,

had set a target for creation of both committees by the end of 2017. But we have been able to meet just 65 to 70 per cent of the target," a senior central BJP leader told PTI on the condition of anonymity. Kailash Vijayvargiya, BJP national general secretary and the Bengal in-charge, however, said the work to constitute committees would most likely be over by next month. "We hope that the work will be completed (forming booth-level committees) by January 2018," he said.

The party's central leadership has also stressed on the need to rope in intellectuals who act as catalysts in creating public opinion. "Due to infighting among a section of leaders the overall growth of the party is getting hampered. A section of leaders is not happy with the present leadership's high-handedness and has become inactive," a senior state BJP leader said. West Bengal BJP president Dilip Ghosh too agreed that the party is yet to reach out to all the booths of the state.

"It is true that we have not been able to reach out to all booths. There are reasons behind it. In minority-dominated districts of Malda, Murshidabad and Nadia, we have a support base, but

TOHIDI ALI peddlers who come mainly from north-eastern states. Says Sunil from Arunachal Pradesh who has been coming to the market for the last 7 years to sell his garments. "Cold winds still slide the city and that is why demand for warm clothes has not yet picked up. But still we hope the situation will improve if mercury drops further down." He says. What is on display at the pavement of the square is a plethora of garments that includes shawls, sweaters, blankets, mufflers, blazers, to name a few. People, chiefly from middle class families of the city and

its suburbs throng the place and purchase garments that suit their pockets.

This year in addition to a lack of a cold spell what added to the woes of the traders was the introduction of GST and that has made the wares costlier.

There has been a sharp increase in price because of introduction of 5 per cent GST for winter garments. I have been selling winter garments here for the last 25 years. Now sales have gone down as GST has been introduced making the garments costlier," Md Nazir Hassan, a seller from Topsis, in eastern Kolkata told the Echo of India. Even customers vouch for the claims of the shopkeepers. "I don't see much crowd this year," Sumita, a housewife from Park Circus who came there to buy sweater for her son," told Echo of India. Echoed Amit from Central Avenue, who bought two jackets from the market, "we get all types of garments in this market. This year price has gone up but we come here because we get all types of garments here."
