

CPM to highligh 'Siliguri's deprivation' in state assembly in upcoming session

SILIGURI, JULY 6: The CPM is going to raise the issue of the alleged deprivation of the Left Front (LF) run Siliguri Municipal Corporation (SMC) by the state government in the state assembly in the coming session. The party leadership is also planning to move court to get its dues from the state government. This was revealed yesterday by Siliguri Mayor and M.L.A. Asok Bhattacharya at his office at SMC. "We will expose the state government during the upcoming session of the state assembly which will start from July 20. If necessary we can knock the door of the court

also," the Mayor said. Bhattacharya also alleged that the state government had adopted a double standard so far as SMC was concerned. "The Chief Minister on the one hand stood by Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal's movement against non-cooperation of the Lieutenant Governor, but on the other hand she deprived the SMC of its dues. The state government has waged a war against the citizens of Siliguri. While other Trinamool run civic bodies received their dues, Rs 1200 crore that was due to SMC under different projects has not been released to the civic body. The ruling party and the state government are now

trying to deprive SMC of its earnings through collection of local taxes. SMC is not being included in different projects. State government is also dillydallying on the issue of releasing the pending instalments to SMC." The mayor has also protested against the decision of Siliguri Jalpaiguri Development Authority (SJDA) to take up projects for the city's development. "The constitution says that work of a local body cannot be done by another body. It is the state government's vindictive stance to allocate fund to SJDA for city's development depriving SMC," he said. Without naming Tourism Minister Gautam Deb

Bhattacharya fired salvos against him saying, "We have crisis of drinking water in SMC areas. But a member of state cabinet from Siliguri has not come forward to resolve the issue." The Trinamool Congress, however, paid no heed to CPM's criticism. "It is a fact that LF is keen to keep SMC under grip than to render services to people. Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has emphasised on Siliguri's all-round development. We have sought a list of pending work from the SMC councilors. Once we get it, SJDA and North Bengal development department will take up the tasks," Minister for tourism Gautam Deb said.

Penalty imposed on Prataparh Natni Urban Coop. Bank

KOLKATA, JULY 6/- The Reserve Bank of India has imposed a monetary penalty of Rs 5,00,000/- (five lakh rupees) on National Urban Co-operative Bank Ltd., Prataparh, Uttar Pradesh in exercise of powers vested in it under the provisions of Section 47A(1)(c) read with Section 46(4) of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949 (As applicable to Co-operative Societies), for violation of RBI Instructions/Guidelines on Exposure Norms and Statutory/Other Restrictions. Know Your Customer/Norms and Obtaining Membership of Credit Information Companies (CICs). The Reserve Bank of India had issued a Show Cause Notice to the bank, in response to which the bank had submitted a written reply. After considering the facts of the case, the Reserve Bank came to the conclusion that the violations were substantial and warranted imposition of penalty.

Three killed in road-accident

Fresh feud over authority of Siliguri's Rabindra Mancha between SJDA and SMC

SILIGURI, JULY 6: Another spat between Siliguri Jalpaiguri Development Authority (SJDA) and Siliguri Municipal Corporation (SMC) seems to be imminent as the North Bengal Development department (NBDD) transferred the management of Rabindra Mancha from SMC to SJDA. While the chairman of SJDA Sourav Chakraborty took stock of the unused auditorium on Thursday, mayor of SMC Asok Bhattacharya sounded firm to retain authority of the auditorium. Rabindra Mancha has

been closed since its inauguration a year ago. NBDD constructed the auditorium at ward no. 31 of SMC spending Rs 10 crore approximately and handed it over to Siliguri Municipal Corporation (SMC). However, not a single cultural programme was staged at Rabindra Mancha since inauguration owing to tug of war between SMC and NBDD on various grounds. Later NBDD took back the authority of management of the auditorium from SMC. However, Rabindra Mancha remained as it was and no cultural programme was held there.

Now, NBDD has rendered the authority of running the auditorium to SJDA in black and white. Chairman of SJDA Sourav Chakraborty with his officials inspected Rabindra Mancha on Thursday. "Rabindra Mancha will be a venue for staging various cultural activities. NBDD has handed over the management of the auditorium to us. We will put the best effort so that Rabindra Mancha turns into a preferred destination of the city's culture-lovers and artists. We believe that some earnings can also be

made from the auditorium," Chakraborty said. He found that the electricity connection of the auditorium had been snapped. "We have to see as to why the electricity-services are not available here," he said. Mayor of SMC Asok Bhattacharya, however, sounded determined about the right of management. "The auditorium was handed over to us by NBDD. The relevant papers of transfer are still lying with us. Rabindra Mancha would be run by SMC. We want that the auditorium is properly utilized," the Mayor said.

Preparations for CM's programme in Jalpaiguri on war-footing

JALPAIGURI, JULY 6: Preparations are underway for the ensuing visit of Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee who would take an administrative review meeting on July 10. The CM is also likely to discuss the problems prevalent in tea-gardens of the region. According to sources in the district administration, the Chief Minister would be reaching Jalpaiguri on around 5 pm on July 9. She would be presiding over the administrative review meetings with the officials of Jalpaiguri and Alipurdar district administrations at Sarojendra Dev Raikar art centre in the evening on the same day. The CM is going to attend the administrative review

meeting for Coochbehar at Changrabandha on July 10. From there she is expected to go spend the night at Mal Bazar. She is likely to attend a meeting to discuss the tea-garden issues on July 11 at Mal Bazar.

Chairman of Siliguri Jalpaiguri development authority (SJDA) Sourav Chakraborty along with officials of the district administrations inspected the venue of the CM's administrative meeting in Jalpaiguri on Thursday. It may be mentioned that the stage of Sarojendra Dev Raikar art centre in Jalpaiguri partially collapsed during a cultural programme a few months ago. Some of the artists on the stage were injured too.

The art centre will have a complete makeover before the arrival of the Chief Minister, Chakraborty said.

Housewife dies of burns, husband and in laws arrested.

JALPAIGURI, JULY 6: A housewife was burnt alive allegedly by her husband and in laws in Jalpaiguri. Police arrested three of the accused on Thursday night after the father of the housewife, Dinesh Saha, lodged a written complaint. It has been alleged by Saha that his daughter Dolly was married to one Robi Saha of Jalpaiguri in 2009. The couple had two daughters too. "Since marriage Robi and his family members tortured my daughter seeking dowry from her. We tried to solve the problem and spoke to Robi and his family members on several occasions. But nothing worked out," Saha said. He claimed that on Wednesday night they were told over phone by some unidentified person that Dolly was in deep trouble. "As we rushed to her house, we were told that she was admitted to hospital. We saw in hospital that she had received serious burns and was battling for life. Eventually she succumbed to her injuries on Thursday morning," he said. The housewife's family lodged a complaint against Robi Saha and six others. Police said that prime accused Robi Saha and two others were arrested on Thursday night. Searches were on for the other accused. A probe was initiated into the complaint.
