

All moujas of Bengal now electrified: Minister

KOLKATA, NOV 29 /-/- All moujas of West Bengal have been given electricity connections during the six-year rule of the Trinamool Congress ministry in the state. The Assembly was informed today. A mouja corresponds to a specific land area within which there could be one or more settlements. Till October 31 last, nearly 1.78 crore electricity connections have been given since May 2011 as compared to 85 lakh in the previous 35-year Left Front rule. power and non-conventional energy minister Sobhandev Chatterjee said during the question hour: It was an increase of over 107 per cent, he said.

Chatterjee admitted that the problem of low voltage is a fact, when the matter was raised by an Opposition MLA. The minister said it was not possible to build sub-stations keeping in pace with new electricity connections. However, the government was making efforts to set up 33 KV lines, sub-stations along with transformers to address the low voltage problem. He also said rampant hooking is also a primary cause for the poor quality voltage. (PTT)

Bihar House passes two bills on Tuesday

PATNA, NOV 29 /-/- Bihar Legislative Assembly passed a bill on Tuesday seeking to replace an ordinance promulgated to transfer 10 acres of land of agriculture department to tourism department for building of a multi-purpose lighting centre and garden based on life of Guru Gobind Singh and amid protest from the Congress and RJD members. The ordinance was promulgated in September last in the 350th birth anniversary year of the 10th Sikh Guru. The land is adjacent to Guru Ka Bagh in Patna Sahib.

Congress members, who raised objection to the intrusion of the name of Guru Gobind Singh in the bill, as well as RJD MLAs, staged a walkout. Earlier, intervening a discussion on the bill, chief minister Nitish Kumar took umbrage at the objection voiced by Vijay Shankar Dubey of Congress to the inclusion of the Sikh Guru's name in the bill and said the "you are not bothered about the image of the state. Your own party's chief minister in Punjab Capt Amarinder Singh would not be happy over your objection".

The chief minister said that grand organization of Prakash Parv of Guru Gobind Singh here on the occasion of his 350th birth anniversary had boosted the image of Bihar across the world and abroad. "No body had expected Bihar to organize such a spectacular function," he said.

He said his government to do everything possible to enhance the image of the state and that he was undertaking excavation of a huge archaeological site belonging to the Buddhist era and spread over 70 acres of land in Laksharai. After his inspection, he said the government passed the bill amid Opposition's walkout. The House also passed another bill providing for better administration of Special Security Group (SSG) entrusted with the security of chief ministers and former chief ministers in the state. (PTT)

Naveen writes to PM on Polavaram project

BHUBANESWAR, NOV 29 /-/- Odisha chief minister Naveen Patnaik today wrote to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, urging him not to allow the construction of the Polavaram project until all the pending issues are settled in the Supreme Court. Patnaik, in his letter, also expressed his deep concern over the sacrifice of Odisha's interest in the project without addressing its legitimate concerns. "It is my earnest request not to allow the construction of the Polavaram project until all the pending issues are finally settled in the Hon'ble Apex Court," he wrote in the letter.

"I am to express my deep concern in the matter in which the interests of Odisha are sacrificed in the matter of the Polavaram project without addressing our legitimate concerns. It is unfortunate that the construction of the project is going on at a rapid pace despite the pendency of the matter in the Hon'ble Supreme Court. I am sure about my previous letters," he said.

Though, the Polavaram project has been declared as a national project in the

Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act, 2014, it does not qualify to be considered as a national project as it does not satisfy the national standards or norms for it, Patnaik said.

"If the project is allowed to be completed before the resolution of all the pending issues, it will cause a permanent injury to the interest of the state of Odisha and its people," the chief minister wrote in the letter. Patnaik said, in his previous letters earlier, he had expressed deep concern regarding submergence of a large number of villages in Odisha, majority of them inhabited by scheduled tribes, if the Polavaram project in its current form is permitted to proceed.

"The project's construction has been taken up by the Government of Andhra Pradesh unilaterally much before obtaining the CWC clearance, based on plans or design that are in violation of the Godavari Water Dispute Tribunal (SWDT) award and such an award issued by the states of Chhattisgarh and Odisha," Patnaik said. The chief minister's letter said the project

works are going on without conducting any public hearing in Odisha, which is mandatory requirement for getting any environmental clearance.

"The issue of public hearing is pending in the court, Patnaik said, adding "it is surprising that neither the concerns of those most affected by the project are considered nor their involvement is sought."

"Patnaik said that there have been a 'clear violation' in obtaining environmental and forest clearance by the ministry, resettlement and rehabilitation clearance by the ministry of tribal affairs and the technical advisory committee clearance by the Central Water Commission (CWC).

The chief minister said that the Polavaram project can be reformulated as per the CWC award, which is causing large scale submergence in Andhra Pradesh, Odisha and Chhattisgarh, taking into consideration the award and such an award issued by the states of Chhattisgarh and Odisha," Patnaik said. National media not giving proper place to Manipur: Guv

IMPHAL, NOV 29 /-/- Governor Najma Heptulla has said that the national media is not giving "proper place" to Manipur. The governor said this while interacting with a delegation of Press Council of India (PCI), Press Association, Indian Journalist Union and Editors Guild of India which called her here last night. "The national media is not giving proper place to Manipur and the state has been in the news, only for wrong reasons particularly related with natural calamities and bandhs," she told the media delegation. The media delegation also called on Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh at the state secretariat, an official statement said.

MLA withdraws support to Meghalaya Cong ministry

TURA, NOV 29 /-/- Independent MLA Rophi S Marak, who was supporting the Congress ministry in Meghalaya today announced that he was withdrawing support to the Mukul Sangma ministry. He said the decision to do so was on the basis of "lack of development" in places across his constituency. "I am answerable to the people of my constituency and the district."

They are asking questions as to what we have done in our tenure of five years. "The development work in South Garo Hills has been dismal. The main problem is road and communication and since I am contesting the upcoming election as an independent candidate, I withdrew my support from Meghalaya United Alliance ministry led by Mukul Sangma," Marak said in a statement. He alleged that the state government has turned down many of his proposals meant for the development of SGH, a region considered one of most backward in Meghalaya. (PTT)

Eight Rohingyas held in Tripura

AGARTALA, NOV 29 /-/- Eight Rohingyas, including four children and two women, were apprehended from Khayerpur Bazar area in West Tripura district, about 10 km from here today, police said. This is the first time that such a large number of people from the community were apprehended from Tripura.

Police had raided the area following a tip-off. Superintendent of Police (Police Control) Pradip De said the Rohingyas claimed to be from Myanmar and produced refugee cards issued by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR).

They had entered the country from Bangladesh in search of jobs. During preliminary interrogation, the Rohingyas claimed that they had travelled to many parts of the country, including Kolkata and Jammu, and came here after being told that there were jobs available, he said. The BSF had last month sounded an alert along the 856 km-long Indo-Bangla International Border in Tripura to check the influx of Rohingyas into the country. (PTT)

Oppn creates ruckus in Bihar Assembly

PATNA, NOV 29 /-/- Opposition MLAs today created ruckus in the Assembly trooping into the well of the House and shouting slogans over law and order in the state, before staging a walkout. Trouble began after Speaker Vijay Kumar Choudhary rejected the notice of an adjournment motion by Lalit Yadav of RJD and Ramdeo Rai and Vijay Shankar Dubey of Congress, saying the House had important business to transact. Leader of Opposition Tejashwi Yadav requested the Speaker to admit the motion since it concerned "a very important issue". When the Speaker did not relent, some opposition members trooped into the well of the House and created a ruckus.

Later, the RJD and Congress members staged a walkout. Earlier, during the Question Hour, Lalit Yadav sought the government's response to a report on illegal withdrawal of money in a district under the Mukhyamantri Nishchay Yojana. Panchayati Raj minister Kapil Dev Kamat said, "An inquiry committee has been constituted to look into the issue. Cases have been lodged against mukhiyas against whom complaints have been received." The district magistrates across the state were asked to go into any such irregularities, he said. Dissatisfied with the minister's reply, Tejashwi Yadav said, "Corruption is widespread in the state. Officers have been trying to whitewash such irregularities. The chief minister should come to the House and clarify the position". Deputy chief minister Sushil Modi assured the members that the government "will not spare anyone involved in any scam, whether it was fodder scam, bitumen scam or Srijan scam". The guilty and the corrupt would be hounded out, no matter where they are hiding, he added. Tejashwi Yadav said the government should tell the House the number of senior officials and ministers against whom action has so far been taken. The Opposition leader also had a heated exchange of words with water resources minister Lalan Singh when, while mentioning various scams, he referred to the incident of a dam collapsing a day prior to its scheduled inauguration by chief minister Nitish Kumar. ER gears up to ensure safety during winter

KOLKATA, NOV 29 /-/- Safety drives are already in progress in Eastern Railway (ER) held a high level performance review meeting on 29 November, 2017 wherein safety of passengers prevailed over all other subjects. The meeting was attended by all the Principal heads of Departments (PHODs) and other senior officers of Eastern Railway. In the meeting, Shri Rao, general manager, emphasized on elaborate counselling of drivers/assistant drivers of trains and ordered for regular foot-plate (on board) inspection by Train Inspectors, Loco Inspectors and Permanent Way Inspectors (PWIs) to ensure safety during the ongoing winter season. In the meeting, chief safety officer of Eastern Railway informed that extensive safety drives are already in progress in Eastern Railway which include (i) 30 days Safety Drive being conducted from 31st October to 29 November, 2017 on precaution to be taken during foggy weather and (ii) 20 days safety drive being conducted from 1st November to 09 December, 2017 to prevent the cases of Signal Passing At Danger. SER to run 5 pairs of weekly winter special trains

KOLKATA, NOV 29 /-/- To ease the extra rush of passengers during winter season, Eastern Railway (SER) has decided to run 5 pairs of special trains between Santragachi and Pudukhery during the period from 02.12.17 to 01.18. 06009 Santragachi-Pudukhery Special leaving Santragachi at 14.10 hrs every Monday till 18th Pudukhery at 20.15 hrs, the next day. In the opposite direction, 06010 Pudukhery-Santragachi Special leaving Pudukhery at 19.15 hrs every Saturday will arrive at Santragachi at 04.30 hrs on Monday. The Special trains consisting of one AC-2 Tier, one AC-3 Tier, seven Sleeper class and six General Second Class coaches will have stoppages at Charugarh, Balasore, Bhadrak, Cuttack, Bhubaneswar, Khurda Road, Brahmapur, Palasa, Sri Kalukulam, Sambalpur, Duvvada, Samalpur, Rajahmundry, Tadepalligudem, Eluru, Vijayawada, Tenali, Chirala, Ongole, Nellore, Gudur, Chennai Egmore, Tambaram, Chengalpattu and Villupuram stations enroute. Bhitarkanika faces rise in mammal population

KENDRAPARA, NOV 29 /-/- The mangrove forest cover in Odisha's Bhitarkanika National Park has registered an impressive rise in mammal population. According to the latest head count report released by the forest department, the enumerators spotted 7,129 mammals of 14 species in Kendrapara district while the figure stood at 6,122 last year. "There has been a substantial increase in mammal population in the park due to adequate conservation measures and vigil by anti-poaching squad of the forest department," Bimal P Acharya, the Divisional Forest Officer (DFO), Bhitarkanika, said.

Deer, wild boars and monkeys formed the sizable chunk of the numbers of mammals in Bhitarkanika. These itinerant species that stray into nearby human settlements on the close periphery of the park damage crops and agriculture fields, thus triggering man-animal conflict. Head count survey of mammals is being undertaken as general perception is that there is massive spurt in the number of spotted deer and wild boar. Growth in number has led animals to stray from habitat areas to hamlets lying on the close periphery of the park, wildlife activists say.

The animals' numbers are proportionate to their habitat corridors. Factors prompting the animals making their way to crop fields and orchards in village areas could also be analysed methodically on the census figures, said the DFO. The forest department conducts annual head count of estuarine crocodiles, winter migrant avian species, and monsoon migrant water birds. Count is also made on the number of Olive Riny turtles engaged in annual mass nesting at Gahirmatha beach.

The Gahirmatha marine sanctuary comes under the administrative jurisdiction of the national park. From observation made in the past by wildlife staff, every year these mammals are increasing in number. A couple of factors are contributing to the rising grasp. First, the rich and lush-green mangrove forest has turned out to be an ideal habitat for hyenas, boars and deer, the DFO said. Besides, lack of human interference in their habitat corridors has also emerged favourable. There is also imbalance in predator-prey base in Bhitarkanika. Unlike the Sundarbans, Bhitarkanika mangroves are devoid of tigers. Only the estuarine crocodiles prey upon these animals, Acharya said. (PTT)
