

# Bhaichung Bhutia snaps all ties with TMC

Partha says he should inform the party about the decision

**KOLKATA, FEB 26 /-** Former Indian football captain Bhaichung Bhutia today announced his decision to quit the Trinamool Congress (TMC). The footballer, who contested elections twice as a TMC candidate and lost both times, took to social media to announce his decision. "As of today I have officially resigned from the membership and all the official and political posts of All India Trinamool Congress party, I am no longer a member of



associated with any political party in India. Bhutia said in a tweet.

Bhutia had unsuccessfully contested the 2014 Lok Sabha elections from Parkeasing and the 2016 West Bengal Assembly elections from Siliguri. The TMC declined to comment on Bhutia resigning from the party. However, according to sources Bhutia had informed the TMC about his decision one month ago as he was no longer interested in being associated with any political party. The Trinamool Congress however did not seem to be taken off guard with

the decision of the former Indian captain. "Sometimes non-political people join the party and they were one of them. He should inform the party about the reason behind his decision," Partha Chatterjee, state minister for education and party secretary general today said. Unconfirmed reports said Bhutia, who was from Sikkim, was in touch with the chief minister of the state Pawan Channing and speculations were rife that he would be sent to Rajya Sabha from that state.

# Eighty Five per cent votes polled in Tripura re-poll till 4pm

**AGARTALA, FEB 26 /-** Around 85 per cent votes were polled till 4 pm in six booths in as many constituencies of Tripura, where re-polling was held today, an election department official said. The EC ordered re-polling in one booth each in Sonamura, Teliamura, Sabroom, Ampur, Kadamtala, Kurti and Dhanpur Assembly constituencies after elections were held on February 18.

Dhanpur is the home turf of chief minister Manik Sarkar since 1998. "The election officially ended at 4 pm. But voters are still standing in queue, so the polling percentage is likely to go up. Polling remained peaceful," additional chief electoral officer Tapas Roy told PTI. There was also no report of malfunctioning of Electronic Voting Machines (EVM) today. Grievances in EVMs were reported at various places during polling on February 18. The CPM had earlier raised questions on the neutrality of the state election department, claiming that re-polling was ordered only in those constituencies where the ruling Left Front had clear winning prospects. Polling for 59 of the 60 Assembly seats was held in the north-eastern state on February 18. Polling was countermanded in the Charilam constituency due to the death of CPM candidate Ramendra Narayan Dey on the day of the election. The results will be declared on March 3. (PTI)

# Collego-girl molested in Up Kanchanjungha express

**MALDA, FEB 26 /-** "Insecurity of solo women railway passengers came to fore again as an army personnel was accused of molesting a collego-girl on board in NJP bound Up Kanchanjungha express today. The accused jawan identified as Pravat Singh was arrested by GRP (Government Railway Police) when the train reached Malda town station around 2 pm. As the girl was allegedly molested after the train left Rampurhat station, the accused would be sent to custody of GRP. Saithia for further legal proceedings as learnt from sources. It has been learnt from

sources in GRP Malda that the complainant-girl was at a side-upper berth of air-conditioned three-tier B-1 coach. She is a resident of Bhainagar area and student of a college in Siliguri. She boarded the train from Sealdah to return home. In her complaint to GRP the girl claimed that since the train had left Rampurhat station, Singh, the accused army personnel posted in Siliguri sitting at a side-lower berth just under hers started misbehaving with her. He allegedly passed lewd comments her and physically molested too. No co-passenger reportedly stood in her favour when she protested.

The girl further alleged that Singh followed her when she headed to lavatory in train. It was then she raised her voice for help and the coach attendant standing nearby rushed to her rescue. Few other passengers gathered there too. The jawan was detained by the passengers. She made a call to GRP's helpline too and informed the incident verbally first. Finally the army jawan was handed over to GRP in Malda. An investigating officer of GRP Malda said, "As per the procedure the accused would be handed over to the coach attendant in Saithia station tomorrow.

## Meghalaya cash seizure

**SHILLONG, FEB 26 /-** Election authorities in poll-bound Meghalaya seized over Rs 36 lakh in cash from East Khasi Hills district today, just a day of the polling for the state Assembly. The seizure was made from the Lad Smit area and follows the seizure of Rs 12 lakh in R-Ihri district on Sunday. The state surveillance team has seized Rs 36.67 lakh from one person under Madanting police station limits today, chief electoral officer F R Kharkongor told PTI. The seizure was made from a coal trader and a resident of West Jaintia Hills district who was travelling on a brand new SUV. The cash was handed over to concerned authorities and investigation is on to find out the source and destination, an election official who was involved in monitoring movements, said. (PTI)

# Masterplans for redevelopment of 600 major stations of Indian rly

**KOLKATA/ NEW DELHI, FEB 26 /-** Indian Railway Stations Development Corporation Limited (IRSDC) is taking up redevelopment of around 600 major railway stations across the country. In this mega exercise, assistance and involvement of all stakeholders like railway passengers, urban planners, architects, engineers are important. Towards this objective of stakeholders' consultation, an idea competition for development of 635 stations on Indian Railways, Station Revjuvenation through Joint Action (SRJAN) has been launched at MyGov portal since Monday. The last date for submission of entries is March 26. IRSDC has also launched competition through MyGov portal for IRSDC logo and tagline. The winner for logo competition will get cash prize of Rs 75,000 and for tagline also will get Rs 75,000. The last date of submission of entries is March 26. IRSDC has carried out one round of empanelment and 11 firms have been empanelled in A, B and C categories. However, for more numbers of architectural firms required to simultaneously work on all stations, hence second round of Re-

# Train services disrupted on Sealdah-Barrackpore section

**KOLKATA, FEB 26 /-** Train services on Sealdah-Barrackpore Section of Eastern Railway's Sealdah Division were disrupted since 4.42 pm on Monday as a group of students obstructed train movements at Agarpara station in protest against escalation of fees for different recruitment examinations to be conducted by Railway Recruitment Board. Normal train services resumed at 4.42 pm with ringing of the obstruction. As a result, 9 EMU trains (5 up and 4 down) were detained en route for 25 minutes each on an average and 1 EMU local had to be cancelled. It is stated that for non-exempted candidates who have to pay Rs. 500/- only as examination fees, Rs. 400/- will be refunded if they appear for the examination. Exemptions for categories like SC/ST/DIVYANG/Ex Service men/women/minorities/economically backward classes will be charged Rs. 250/- only. The total amount will be refunded to those candidates from these categories who appear for the examination. These fees will ensure only serious candidates to appear. It is further stated that nearly one lakh posts in different categories of Gr.C and Level 1 (erstwhile Gr. D) and Level 2 categories to be filled up by Indian Railways which is the world's largest recruitment process initiated by Ministry of Railways. (EOIC)

For Chandigarh, Anand Vihar (Delhi), Secunderabad, Bangalore and Pune, tenders for integration of station management through private parties have been called. Through these contracts, integrated management of stations will be done through private parties. Tenders for redevelopment of Chandigarh, Anand Vihar, Bijwasan and Surat stations are expected in March 18. (EOIC)

**KOLKATA, FEB 26 /-** One of the world's biggest examination seasons begins next month in Bengal with Madhyamik. Higher Secondary, ICSE and a number of other examinations. Avijit Ghosh, vice-

president of distribution services assured CESC consumers on Monday that a series of steps to strengthen the Company's distribution system has already been taken to ensure uninterrupted power supply. According to one estimate, nearly a million households are involved and it is important that there is no power disruption when students spend unusually long hours in their homes preparing for the examinations. Ghosh added, "Not only the examination dates are very important, but also these dates are preceded by several weeks of intense preparation at home when consumers demand good light — not to mention uninterrupted light at home during day and night. Madhyamik begins on March 12, followed by Higher Secondary on March 27 and ending on April 11. During examinations, CESC will remain constantly in touch with different examination authorities. A fleet of 150 radio-fitted mobile vans will be moving day and night across the CESC licensed area so that the Company's experts can reach the site, if needed, at the earliest possible opportunity. CESC is also lining up emergency generators so that these can provide relief to affected consumers. Like the previous year, two special holidays are being put up temporarily to keep in touch with examination centres. These are 9831079666 and 9831083700. This is over and above the three CESC Call Centre numbers 1912, 4031912 and 1806001912. The special helplines will remain active till April 13 from 9 am to 4 pm. "The CESC spokesman added, "We are aware of the fact that the exams are important that even parents get fully involved during the preparation time and the whole family is keen that sufficient light is available to them day and night." CESC this year is launching a campaign providing dos and don'ts to get the best possible light. For instance: Dusting of tube lights can help get brighter light during study hours. Correct distance between the table lamp and the eyes can prevent fatigue. Users, as a safety measure, must not touch any electrical switch with wet hands. Similarly electrical plugs should be pulled out carefully while disconnecting supply. There is a strong assurance from CESC that it is ready to supply as much power as will be needed by its 3.2 million consumers during the exam season.

To a question whether there would be any technical hurdle due to the expiry of her term as the director of a department of Visva Bharati two days ago, Sen declined to comment. A senior Visva Bharati official said the institution is yet to nominate two members to a Search Committee for selecting a new vice-chancellor for the varsity as asked by the HRD ministry on February 25.
