

Rotten meat will raise awareness of risk of animal food: FIAPO

KOLKATA, MAY 16 /- The Federation of Indian Animal Protection Organisations (FIAPO) today said the carcass meat recovered from dumping grounds in West Bengal would hopefully raise awareness on the health risks of consuming animal products.

"With the extraordinary increase in lifestyle diseases, from kidney disease to heart disease may be it is time we re-look at our diet...to move towards a greener diet over one including animal products," FIAPO director Varda Mehrotra said in a statement here.

Stating that it has information that meat consumption in the city is going down, Mehrotra said that many people were avoiding

it after reports that meat was coming from dead animals of dumping grounds.

"Meat being sourced from rotten bones of cats, dogs and even diseased animals in unhygienic conditions is not uncommon. Animals bred for the purpose of meat are routinely given anti-biotics, growth hormones and other drugs and their meat may contain these drugs with many viruses and bacteria."

"Hopefully this situation can bring awareness...the FIAPO director said. He said many people could not make the difference between the meat of carcass of three food items like meat, eggs, dairy, fish and seafood," he said.

Dr Pramod Tripathy, founder of Freedom from

Diabetes was quoted as saying, "hypothyroid, osteoporosis, diabetes, high cholesterol cardiovascular disease and cancer... all seemingly unrelated diseases have one thing in common. And that is, raised fasting insulin levels."

"Insulin rises in the body because of insulin resistance. And insulin resistance increases because of excess fat, excess acid and insulin like growth factor (present in all animal products)," he said. Leading nutritionist and holistic wellness counselor Dr Ira Rattan said, "progression of Prion/Diagnosis Chronic Renal Failure (CRF) is slower on diets based on soya protein than on diets based on animal protein." Six suspected Maoists held from hotel

DHANBAD, MAY 16 /- A Giridih police team has arrested six suspected Maoists from an upscale hotel near Dhanbad railway station, police said today. Giridih superintendent of police Surendra Kumar today confirmed the arrest and said it was made in the early hours of May 15. He said the interrogation of the six suspected Maoists is on and on the basis of the information got from them, search operations have been launched in the dense forests of Giridih, a Maoist hotbed, the SP added. Prime Minister is scheduled to visit Dhanbad on May 25 to address a public rally and through remote lay the foundation stones of a power plant of the Adani group at Godda, an AIIMS and an international airport at Deoghar and a unit of Hindustan Urvarak Rasayan Limited at Sindri. Among those arrested from the hotel was Jitan Marandi, who was an accused of the 2011 Chikanki massacre by Maoists in which 19 villagers, including the younger son of former Jharkhand chief minister Babul Marandi were gunned down, the police said. Jitan Marandi, who hails from Giridih, was sentenced to death by the lower court but was executed by the High Court in 2015. Police said Jitan Marandi and three other Maoists, who have been identified by the Giridih police, had checked into the hotel around May 14 midnight and furnished their Aadhar cards as proof of identity. They took two rooms of the hotel and then telephoned two officers of the High Court in 2015. Police said Jitan Marandi had put Jitan Marandi on surveillance and located him by his mobile tower and arrested all the six after a few hours. (PTT)

Smuggled gold biscuits seized

AIZAWL, MAY 16 /- Mizoram police have seized 13 gold biscuits reportedly smuggled from Myanmar at Zembawar near Aizawl on Monday night, a police statement said here today. Police departments public relations officer said that the seized gold weighing 13 kg was worth around Rs 4.29 crore on the prevailing rate of gold bullion. One Lalbiakthuma (24) was arrested in this connection for allegedly concealing the gold biscuits in his jacket. He was handed over to the officials of the Customs department of Aizawl division. Man dies after falling into gorge

TURGA, MAY 16 /- A man was killed after he fell into a gorge from a dilapidated timber bridge in West Garg Hills district, police said today. The man identified as 36-year-old Anand Borah fell down from the old Rogkhon Bridge on the outskirts of Turga after his car got stuck in the bridge last night, they said. "We received information this morning about the incident after which a police team visited the spot, the body of the victim was recovered and has been taken for post mortem and details are awaited," said Superintendent of Police of West Garg Hills, Dr MGR Kumar. Police reports said that the car that Borah was driving got stuck near the end of the bridge. "We are of the opinion that as it was night he may have got down to check his car and there was no timber, he missed his footing and fell down the gorge and may have died due to the fall. We will be able to provide further details after investigation," the SP added. (PTT)

Fake job racket busted

BHUBANESWAR, MAY 16 /- The police on Tuesday claimed to have busted a fake job racket and arrested six persons on charges of misleading unemployed youths with false promises. The racket was running from a house at Koliathia under Khandagiri police limits here, police said today. The police seized 75 passes, visiting cards of different tours and travel agencies, 200 application forms with bio-data and photographs, PAN cards, voter identity cards and Aadhar cards from their possession," said commissioner of police Y B Khurana. A police team raided the house at Koliathia area following a tip-off from a local resident that an agency had arranged for an interview at a guest house at Koliathia. About 250-300 youths were attending the interview, sources said. The agency used to dupe job aspirants by luring them with attractive offers from Gulf countries. The racket had engaged local youths from Odisha to trap job-seekers. (PTT)

Worker electrocuted

ITANAGAR, MAY 16 /- A worker of Arunachal Pradesh power department died of electrocution while installing new electric poles near Bordura village, 8 km from Khonsa, the headquarters of Tirap district. The deceased, a casual worker, identified as Wangkho alias Akko Wangsa, a native of Pongchhu village under Longding district, came to work with live wire while installing new poles and died on the spot on Tuesday, an official release said here today. Three other casual workers of the departments Khonsa division sustained severe injuries in the incident. The injured have been sent to the Assam Medical College and Hospital, Dibrugarh for treatment. Chief Minister Pema Khandu has expressed shock and grief over death of the worker. While extending condolences to the family members, Khonsa today announced ex-gratia relief to the next of kin as per the laid down norms. He also wished speedy recovery of the injured. (PTT)

Sikkim celebrates 43rd statehood day

GANGTOK, MAY 16 /- Sikkim celebrated its 43rd statehood day with great fanfare today. It was on this day in 1975 that Sikkim had officially become a state under the Union of India and Kazi Lhendup Dorjee became its first chief minister. A grand function was held at the Samman Bhawan auditorium in the capital town where chief minister Pawan Kumar Chamling highlighted the achievements of his government. Sikkim has witnessed massive development and progress over the last two decades under his government, said Chamling, who has broken the record of former West Bengal Jyoti Basu as the longest serving chief minister by being in office for nearly 24 years. "Our GDP has increased by 5154.80 times which speaks volumes on the state's development and progress. Similarly, our per capita income and revenue generation have increased substantially," he said. He said the salaries of the state government employees had increased by 2,412 per cent after the last pay revision in 2008. The recent recommendations submitted by the Pay Commission and accepted by the state government will further enhance their salaries. Similarly in the case of retired government employees there has been more than 2100 per cent increase in their pensions, Chamling added. Sikkim has the highest number of employees on the government pay roll constituting about 14 per cent of its population. Sikkim Governor N Shrinivas Patil speaking at the same programme greeted the people of Sikkim on the occasion. (PTT)

CBI arrests ONGC official

GUWAHATI, MAY 16 /- A senior ONGC official was arrested today by the CBI for allegedly taking a bribe of Rs 20 lakh in Assam's Sivasagar district today. The CBI had received a complaint wherein the complainant alleged that ONGC Assam Asset's deputy general manager A K Singh was demanding a bribe of Rs 12 lakh for passing his pending bills, a CBI press release said here. An FIR was registered on Tuesday 018 under section 7 of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 on the basis of the complaint received. The accused was caught red handed while he was demanding and accepting illegal gratification of Rs 20 lakh from the complainant today. The accused has been arrested and will be produced before the CBI Special Judge in Guwahati tomorrow. Searches are being conducted at his residential and official address, the release added. (PTT)

Assam CM reviews flood preparedness

GUWAHATI, MAY 16 /- Assam chief minister Sarbananda Sonowal today directed Water Resources Department (WRD) and other related departments to remain fully prepared to tackle floods during the coming monsoon season, an official release said here. The chief minister reviewed the flood preparedness with water resources minister Keshab Mahanta and senior officials. Floods caused by heavy rain in the state as well as in upper reaches of its neighbours are a recurring problem for Assam that affects its people and economy. During the last two years a total length of 12.02 km new embankments were created and 103 km of embankments strengthened, the release said. Moreover, during the same period 44 anti-erosion and town protection works were completed as against 28 during the last two years of the previous government, it said. Sonowal also directed the WRD to maintain vigilance during the flood season to ensure safety of the river embankments and to store adequate flood fighting materials near vulnerable points. (PTT)

Ten persons rescued from suspected couriers, 2 held

RANGIA, MAY 16 /- Five minor boys and five men, allegedly being trafficked, have been rescued from the clutches of two suspected couriers at Rangia railway station, a RPF official said. The two men accompanying them have been apprehended, the Railway Protection Force official said. The minors were to board a train for New Jalpaiguri from where they would have been taken to Nepal while the five others, in their early 20s, were being sent to Ludhiana, the RPF official said. Acting on a tip-off, the RPF personnel rescued them from a platform of the Rangia railway station on Tuesday when they were about to be taken outside the state by the two suspected couriers. RPF officer-in-charge Asoke Das said. The 10 persons, who were allegedly being trafficked were in two groups, Das said. Das said the minors hail from

Bamuniung village under Chhaygaon police station limits in Kamrup district while the five men were residents of Biswanath Chariali village in Sonitpur district. The two suspected couriers, identified as Rajib Madahi and Hemanta Madahi of Bishnupur Madhali village in Baksa district, were apprehended by the RPF. Duplicate copies of Aadhar Card, driving licence, PAN card, ATM card, two mobile handsets, a SIM card of Nepal, besides railway tickets were recovered from their possession. (PTT)
