### 356 honour killing cases reported in 2014-16: Ahir

NEW DELHI, JUL 31 /- /- As many as 356 cases of honour killings were reported in the country between 2014-16, the Lok Sabha was informed today. Union Minister of State for Home Hansraj Gangaram Ahir, in a written reply, said the ministry has advised all states about the preventive, remedial and punitive measures to be implemented to address the issues related to honour crimes. According to the latest published information available with the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), a total of 28 cases, with honour killing as the motive, were reported in the country in 2014, 251 cases in 2015 and 77 cases in 2016, he said. These include cases registered under section 302 (murder) and section 304 (culpable homicide not amounting to murder) of the IPC, he said. (PTI)

### CPI (M) demands Kiran Bedi's recall

PUDUCHERRY, JUL 31 /- /- CPI(M) today staged a demonstration here against Puducherry Lt Governor Kiran Bedi over her style of functioning and urged the Centre to recall her immediately. Secretary of the local CPI(M) unit R Rajangam, who led the protest, alleged that Bedi had been functioning with the "sole aim of promoting BJP in the union territory. The induction of three BJP functionaries as nominated MLAs, holding meeting with officials and carrying out various administrative decisions "arbitrarily skipping" the ministry confirmed she was "keen on implementing her hidden agenda to promote the BJP", he charged. He urged the Centre to immediately recall her. Slogans were raised against Bedi by the protesters. (PTI)

### HC grants bail to 1984 anti-Sikh riots case convict

NEW DELHI, JUL 31 /- /- The Delhi High Court granted today bail to a 91-year-old man serving life term in a 1984 anti-Sikh riots case on health grounds. A bench headed by Chief Justice Gita Mittal and Justice Anu Malhotra released retired naval officer Captain Bhagmal on bail for a period of six weeks. "Keeping in view the age and health condition of the appellant, we grant him bail for a period of six weeks," the bench said while imposing the same conditions which it had issued earlier. Bhagmal, through his counsel, had moved the plea seeking bail on ground of ill health. "During the hearing, senior advocate H S Phoolka, appearing for the 1984 anti-Sikh riots victims, sought an early hearing in the matter and argued that 91 years have passed since the tragic incident but the justice was yet to be delivered in the case. He told the court that he would move an application seeking early hearing on day-to-day basis for speedy disposal of the case. The bench then posted the matter for hearing on August 3. Bhagmal, former Congress commander Balwan Khokhar, Giridhari Lal and two others were held guilty in a case relating to the murder of five members of a family in Raj Nagar area of Delhi Cantonment on November 1, 1984, after the assassination of Prime Minister Indira Gandhi. They had challenged their conviction and the sentence awarded by the trial court in May 2013. The trial court had acquitted Congress leader Sajjan Kumar but awarded life term to Bhagmal, Khokhar and Giridhari Lal and three-year jail term to two others former MLA Mahender Yadav and Kishan Khokhar. The convicts have filed appeal before the High Court while the CRT too has filed an appeal alleging that they were engaged in "a planned communal riot" and "religious cleansing". The agency has also appealed against acquittal of Kumar. The high court had on March 29 issued show cause notices to 11 accused including Khokhar and Yadav in five 1984 anti-Sikh riots cases. The accused, who were acquitted of the charges, were asked why should the court not order reinvestigation and retrial against them as they faced allegations of "horrifying crimes against humanity". The bench had issued notices on the complaints filed regarding the violent incidents of May 1984 and 1984 in the Delhi Cantonment area. (PTI)

### Kerala robot to clean up TN temple town

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM, JUL 31 /- /- Robotic scavenger 'Bandicoot', product of a Kerala-based start-up, would soon be cleaning sewers in the temple town of Kumbakonam in Tamil Nadu. The product was handed over to Kumbakonam Municipality by the Indian Oil Corporation as part of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR). The machine was recently launched by Commissioner of Municipal Administration, Tamil Nadu, G Prakash in the presence of Kumbakonam sub collector M Pradeep Kumar, General Manager (HR), IndianOil, Tamil Nadu were among those present, an IOC press release said. There are about 5,000 manholes in Kumbakonam Municipality which are to be regularly cleaned. The Municipality has been cleaning approximately 400-500 sewer manholes a month using mechanical arms. The procedure is cumbersome and involves manual intervention at times, it said. In order to automate these works, IndianOil has provided the manhole cleaning Robo. Municipal Commissioner of Kumbakonam Municipality, Uma Maheswari said. The robot has been developed by Genrobotics, Thiruvananthapuram. The robot is promoted by a group of engineers from Kerala. The innovative product has the potential to eliminate manual scavenging and effectively clean the sewage and manholes, thus saving many precious human lives. Chief Executive Officer of Genrobotics, Vimal Govind claimed. The Kerala government would also be utilising the services of Robots to clean sewer holes, he said. He robot, equipped with Wi-Fi, bluetooth and control panels has four limbs and a bucket system attached to a spider web looking extension to scoop out the waste from sewers. The project is supported by Kerala Water Authority (KWA) which has joined hands with Kerala start up mission to transform new ideas into practical technologies for addressing issues relating to pipe leakage and sanitation.
