# Open to discussions: Delhi officers after CM's assurance on security

# CIC directs govt to make public MPLADS fund utilisation details

**NEW DELHI, JUN 18 /--/** The CIC has directed the government to proactively disclose on its website the details of works undertaken under the Members of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme (MPLADS) in every constituency. The directive came after the Central Information Commission (CIC) was told by the Ministry of Statistics and Program Implementation (MoSPI) that it releases the MPLADS fund utilisation details on its website but does not keep a record of the works done, except statistics. Information Commissioner Sridhar Acharyulu said the ministry was receiving utilisation certificates from district authority, but did not upload any utilisation detail on the website.

Every Member of Parliament (MP) gets Rs 5 crore annually to undertake development works of his choice in his constituency, known as the Members of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme (MPLADS). Sub-inspector Ishwar Singh and head constable Pawan Kumar have been suspended with immediate effect, Rakesh Gupta, additional principal secretary to the chief minister, said. He gave directions for their suspension during a review meeting of the government's Social Media Grievances Tracker and conduct. Gupta said the video showed a few people stabbing a youth with a knife in Jind district recently. "Sub-inspector Ishwar Singh and head constable Pawan Kumar were present near the place of incident fled the spot instead of saving the youth. Moreover, they did not even inform the police station nearby," he said. In another video on Khattar's Twitter handle, driver Shankar Singh and conductor Vijay Kumar of Charkhi Dabri depot of Haryana Transport department were seen misbehaving with passengers. # HC virtually disapproves Kejriwal's sit-in at LG's office, asks AAP govt who authorised protest

After hearing arguments, the court listed the matter for hearing on June 22. Kejriwal and his ministers have been staying in at the LG's office since June 11 evening to press for their demands, including a direction to IAS officers to end their "strike" and action against those who have struck work.
