

## HC takes note of Lucknow varsity violence; DGP orders probe

**LUCKNOW, JULY 5** /- Taking suo motu cognizance of the violence in Lucknow University, the Allahabad High Court today summoned its top officials, besides the U/DGP to explain the attack, prompting the police chief to ask an inspector general rank officer to probe the campus clashes. Amid the developments at the high court, Uttar Pradesh Director General of Police P Singh acted swiftly and handed over the probe into the violence to Lucknow Range IGP Sujet Pandey, transferred Circle Officer Anurag Singh and suspended university police out-post in charge Pankaj Mishra. The DGP's action came after a delegation of Lucknow University (LU) teachers led by Vice Chancellor S P Singh called on him here this afternoon. Taking serious note of the incident, the DGP assured the VC of strict action against those who indulged in violence and asked the teachers to go back to work. "I have handed over the probe into the Lucknow varsity violence to IG (Lucknow range). I have transferred the circle officer con-

cerned and suspended the LU police out-post in-charge," the DGP said. "I have also assured the teachers of strict action and have appealed to them to return to their work," he said. While summoning the University's vice chancellor, registrar and proctor, the HC bench of the Lucknow bench of the high court also ordered Lucknow senior superintendent of police to be present before it and explain the incident. The order was issued by a bench of justices Vikram Nath and Rajesh Singh Chauhan following media reports of a group of students assaulting the vice chancellor and other top officers of the university yesterday.

The VC, the registrar and the SSP were asked to be present before the bench at 10.15 am tomorrow and explain as to why the police did not respond promptly when the LU authorities informed it about the imminent attack. The court also asked the two top police officers to detail the steps taken in the wake of violence to improve the security situation in the university campus. The court took on

record the copies of a Hindi and an English daily and directed its registry to register the matter as a Public Interest Litigation with its title as 'Lucknow University Vandalism'. Expressing annoyance over the incident and questionable role of the local police, the bench said, "It is unfortunate and extremely painful that the students have the courage, audacity and boldness to enter the premises from where they have been expelled and create physical violence and attack the vice chancellor, teachers and staff of the university." In its order, the court noted, "In all the leading newspapers of Lucknow, one of the front-page news is about the attack on the teachers of LU, forcing the vice chancellor to close the university indefinitely (sine die) and stalling the entire admission process for the Academic Year 2018-19." "The reports further mention that on July 4, 2018 a group of about 25 students, which included some of the students who had been expelled, entered the University premises firstly around 11.30 AM and surrounded the vice chancellor and

raised slogans and also threatened him of dire consequences and demanded re-admission. Later again at about 1.30 PM, the VC was returning from a function inside the University premises, these students again attacked the vice chancellor and his security. Some 10 teachers of the university were injured along with several security and other staff of the university," the bench wrote in its order. The bench further noted in its order that the newspaper reports mentioned that the police was informed about the likelihood of the expelled students creating ruckus, but despite the same, the local police did not take appropriate measures to control the situation which was apprehended by the University administration. The university was closed till further orders yesterday after a group of students protesting over admission to the new academic session reportedly attacked teachers, injuring over a dozen of them, officials said. The LU vice chancellor said the youths called were from the Samajwadi Party (PTI)

## Sedition row: JNU panel upholds punishment for Umar Khalid, Kanhaiya Kumar



**NEW DELHI, JULY 5** /- The JNU's high-level inquiry committee has upheld Umar Khalid's rustication and a fine of Rs 10,000 imposed on Kanhaiya Kumar in connection with the February 9, 2016 incident. The JNU panel had in 2016 recommended rustication of Khalid and two other students and imposed a fine of Rs 10,000 on Kumar, the then students' union president, in connection with the campus event against Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav during which anti-national slogans were allegedly raised. The five member panel had also imposed financial penalty on 13 other students for violation of disciplinary norms. The students had then moved the Delhi High Court, which had directed the university to place the matter before an appellate authority to review the panel's decision. According to sources, the panel has upheld its decision in the case of Khalid and Kumar. "The penalty has also been reduced for some students," a source said. Umar, Khalid and Anirban Bhattacharya were arrested in February 2016 on charges of sedition in connection with the controversial event and are out on bail. Their arrest had triggered widespread protests. (PTI)

**AMETHI (UP), JULY 5** /- Congress chief and local MP Rahul Gandhi today held a 'janta darbar' during which he listened to the problems of the people of his constituency. Rahul, who is on a two-day visit here, started his second day by meeting people from different walks of life in the premises of the Congress office in Gauriganj - the district headquarters. Former Union minister and MP Sanjay Singh and his wife Ameeta Singh met the Congress president and discussed with him issues related to the party and the people.

A discussion on how to make the Congress stronger in Uttar Pradesh was held with Rahulji," Sanjay Singh said. A number of students, party activists, people from the trade and business fraternity also met Gandhi. Sangita Anand, daughter of former Uttar Pradesh minister and senior BJP leader Ram Laxhan Passi, and her husband also met Gandhi.

Asked about the meeting, Anand said she was here to see "my MP and nothing else". Later in the day, Rahul will visit party leader Babunath Tiwari, whose wife passed away recently, to offer his condolences. The MP is also expected to meet former block pramukh of Amethi - Ram Murti Shukla. Gandhi will pay homage to CRPF personnel A Maurya at Naraini village in the Amethi assembly segment. Maurya was martyred during a Naxal attack in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district in April. He will also address a gathering of farmers on the premises of Mukutnath Inter College in Tala village on the Amethi-Gauriganj highway. (PTI)

## Karnataka minister travels 340 km daily to office and back

**BENGALURU, JULY 5** /- Karnataka Public Works Minister H D Revanna commutes a gruelling 340 km every day for work from his hometown to Bengaluru and back, but insists it has nothing to do with either astrology or "Vastu". The elder brother of Chief Minister H D Kumaraswamy cites non-availability of a government bungalow as the reason for undertaking the tedious journey. Media reports suggested that this is a Vastu compliant home prompted Revanna to travel from Holenarasipura to the state capital, a one way distance of 170 km, every day by his car, ignoring the advice of his father and former prime minister H D Deve Gowda. Revanna, however, dismissed the reports. "I am born under Swati Nakshatra. Things like Vastu do not affect those born under this star. Even black magic or spell does not work on us. It boomerangs on people trying black magic on those born under this Nakshatra," said Revanna. The minister said he was forced to travel such a long distance every day because the government has not allotted him living quarters. "Had they (government) given me a house, I would have lived in the government quarters. They have not given me quarters even in the Legislators' Home. I am ready to live wherever they want me to stay. Because they haven't given me a house, I am travelling 340

km every day," he told PTI. He said the quarters allotted to him at Legislators' Home earlier has been locked and the bungalow assigned to him is still occupied by the previous PWD minister H C Mahadevappa. "Until he vacates, I cannot go and stay there. We cannot remove somebody forcibly," said Revanna. If someone thought that undertaking such a long trip every day would take a toll on the 61-year-old Revanna's health, he has a different story to tell. "The JD(S) leader said it helps him keep his sugar levels under check and reduces bodyache. No matter when he reaches Holenarasipura at night, Revanna gets up at 5 am, gets ready, offers prayers at five temples, meets people who through his residence with grievances, and leaves for Bengaluru at 8 am sharp. The Deve Gowda family's fancy for Vastu and abiding faith in astrology is well known. Before Kumaraswamy's oath-taking ceremony, the entire family went on a pilgrimage to places like Tirupati, Sharada temple and Shankaracharya Peetha in Sringeri. A couple of days ago, Revanna took a priest to task for wrongly performing the groundbreaking ceremony of a women's hostel at Hassan Institute of Medical Sciences. Revanna scolded the priest for not even knowing which direction the ritual should be performed.

## Nurse held on charge of bid to reveal rape victim's identity

**INDORE JULY 5** /- Police have arrested a senior nurse of the state-run Maharaja Yeshwantrao Hospital (MYH) here on the charge of trying to reveal the identity of the Mandausa gangrape victim by clicking the minor's pictures on her phone, a senior official said today. Talking to PTI, Deputy Inspector General (DIG) of Police Harinarayanachari Mishra said the police personnel posted near the ward in MYH, where the victim is undergoing treatment, got the information that senior nurse Rama Kushwaha (50) had clicked photos of the eight-year-old victim and her medical reports on her mobile camera. During an investigation, the information was found to be authentic, he said. The nurse is being questioned as to why she clicked the pictures of the victim and her medical documents. It is suspected that she wanted to send these photos to someone, Mishra added. The DIG said that a case has been filed against the nurse under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (POCSO) and relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC). A detailed investigation is underway. The victim was raped on June 26 after being abducted from outside her school by two men.

## Lynching aftermath: Rainpada village becomes a ghost place

**RAINPADA (MAHA), JULY 5** /- Rainpada, a remote village of Maharashtra which was the scene of brutal lynching of five men five days back, has virtually turned into a ghost place. In the village with a population of 750, only a few elderly people and some women can be spotted as the young men have fled in the wake of intensified police investigation into the lynching. On last Sunday, five tribals were lynched here by a large mob on suspicion of child lifting, an incident that shocked the nation as it was yet another case of brutality triggered by social media rumours. According to videos which went viral, one of the five victims apparently tried to speak to a six-year-old girl after which they were pounced upon, stoned and thrashed with sticks and arrows. The police has arrested 23 people so far and is looking for others who were involved in the incident in this remote village, located around 100 km from the Dhule district headquarters and bordering Gujarat state. "Our men have left their homes since Sunday and there is no contact with them since. Only the women and a few elderly people are left here now," says 72-year-old Dasubai Gaikwad, a resident of the village. She said since the young men have left, there is nobody to arrange for food and open water supply tanks that bring water to the village. This reporter saw most houses locked and the narrow lanes empty, with only cattle and livestock roaming around. Vishwas Gangurde, a member of the panchayat samiti, said the village comprises about 750 people, of whom only a dozen old men and women are left. "The young men, who fled the village, could not take their elders along with them as they are not physically fit. As a result, they are lying in their homes unable to even walk as they do not have the strength to do so in the absence of food," said 45-year-old Kalubai RAU another villager. Rajubai Kokni, a teacher at the lo-

cal school in the village, said out of the total of 102 students enrolled, nobody has turned up to study since the incident. "I have been coming here since Monday morning but no student turns up. I sit idle all day and close the school at the end of the day," she said. Kokni said her husband Rajaram too was arrested by the police when he was working at his farm on Sunday. "Being a Sunday, that accompanied my husband at the farm as well. We were sowing seeds there when out of nowhere the police personnel came and arrested my husband. I have not heard from him since," she said. "The main perpetrators were from our villages. However, our men are suffering the most," she alleged. Kokni said that being a Sunday, people from several adjoining villages had come to the weekly market in Rainpada to buy clothes, vegetables, soaps and oil on display. Gounda Deshmukh, whose sister's son was arrested by the police, claimed he was picked up from outside a clinic where he had gone to take medicines. "The police came and randomly caught people and put them in police vans. My sister's son had nothing to do with the lynching," she said. Gangurde, a witness to Sunday's incident, said when the five men were taken to the panchayat samiti office for questioning, people from adjoining villages called up their friends and around 3,000 people gathered and indulged in lynching. "We kept pleading with them not to hit the men but they accused us of taking money from them to save them. They did not want them (victims) to be handed over to the police but kill them there itself. We had to back out when they threatened to kill us too," he said. Dhule Superintendent of Police M Ramkumar said his personnel were trying to distribute food material to the elderly and the women to ensure they do not go hungry. "We are sharing with villagers the food collected for our personnel," Ramkumar said. (PTI)

## 191 canal water theft cases registered in Punjab

**CHANDIGARH, JULY 5** /- The Punjab Water Resources Department has registered 191 water theft cases in the current paddy season during past three weeks. Around 118 cases of water theft were registered in Ferozpur Canal Circle, an official spokesperson said. Monitoring of the canals would continue to stop any water thefts and anyone found guilty would not be spared. Water Resources Minister Sukhbinder Singh Sarkaria said in a statement here. He directed the officials of his department to take stern action against the culprits and said that any dereliction of duty would not be tolerated. Sarkaria assured the farmers of sufficient water supply for their paddy and other Kharif crops. He appealed to the farmers to decrease the dependence on ground water by using water saving techniques early and need less water. (PTI)

## SC seeks response of Sajjan Kumar on plea against his anticipatory bail

**NEW DELHI, JULY 5** /- The Supreme Court today sought response from Congress leader Sajjan Kumar, accused in 1984 anti-Sikh riots cases, on a plea filed by the SIT challenging the anticipatory bail granted to him by the Delhi High Court. A bench of Justice A K Sikri and Ashok Bhushan said it is high time that these cases are tried at the earliest. The bench said it was an over 30-year-old case and took around "200 pages" for the high court to grant anticipatory bail when it could have been done in just "40-50 pages". Additional Solicitor General Manoj Singh, appearing for the SIT, said the investigation started against Kumar only in 2016 and now he has come armed with a battery of lawyers and dictates his statement to the investigating officer of the case. The ASG said that while granting anticipatory bail to him, the high court had said that everything will be tested in trial of the case but at the end it granted him the relief saying there was no evidence. To this, the bench said whether all this was considered at the time of anticipatory bail? Singh said, "Yes, this is totally contrary to the established procedure of law". The bench then issued notice. The Delhi High Court had on February 22 upheld a trial court order granting anticipatory bail to Congress leader Kumar in two anti-Sikh riots cases of 1984, saying that according to records, he was available throughout the investigation. The Congress leader was granted anticipatory bail by the trial court on December 21, 2016 in two cases of killing of three Sikhs during the riots which had occurred after the assassination of then prime minister Indira Gandhi. Kumar had submitted that his name was never taken earlier and it was a case of fresh allegations coming up after 32 years. (PTI)

## Hundreds of Kailash Mansarovar pilgrims stranded at high-altitude places in Nepal evacuated: MEA

**NEW DELHI, JULY 5** /- Hundreds of Kailash Mansarovar Yatra pilgrims from India stranded at high-altitude areas in Nepal due to inclement weather have been evacuated, with 53 flights and 142 chopper sorties taking people to places of safety, the External Affairs Ministry said today. The Indian mission in Nepal has undertaken a "massive exercise" to evacuate the pilgrims both from Hilsa and Simikot, Ministry of External Affairs Spokesperson Ravesh Kumar said. He said evacuation efforts were still on and if the weather holds, those Indians still stranded would also be taken to places of safety. In the last three days, 883 pilgrims were evacuated from Simikot to Surkhet and also from Simikhot to Nepalganj. 675 pilgrims were evacuated from Hilsa to Simikhot. 53 civilian flights were operated to get the pilgrims out and 142 chopper sorties were carried out," Kumar said.

He said the situation was "fast returning to normal" and about 50 pilgrims were in Surkhet, while 500 were in Simikot. Kumar asserted that there was no "crisis situation" and pilgrims were continuing with the yatra, which is conducted through private tour operators. The pilgrimage to Kailash Mansarovar in the Tibetan region of China is considered holy by Hindus, Buddhists and Jains. Every year, hundreds of Indians undertake the 'yatra' which involves trekking under inhospitable conditions. The ministry is issuing an advisory for pilgrims planning to undertake the Kailash Mansarovar Yatra through Nepal, saying there were "high chances" of getting stranded in various legs of the journey in case of inclement weather. ## Man held for rape threat to Cong spokesperson's daughter

**AHMEDABAD/MUMBAI, JULY 5** /- The Mumbai Police has arrested a 36-year-old man in Gujarat for allegedly giving a rape threat to Twitter to the daughter of Congress spokesperson Priyanka Chaturvedi, an official said today. Priyanka's daughter was arrested from Bavla near Ahmedabad late last night, a senior police official said. The accused was being brought to Mumbai and would be produced in the Dindoshi court later in the day, he said. Following a directive from the Union Home Ministry, the police had registered a case against Twitter user @GirishK1605 for threatening to rape Chaturvedi's 10-year-old daughter. The case was registered under Section 509 (word, gesture intended to insult the modesty of a woman) of the Indian Penal Code, and relevant sections of the Information Technology Act and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, on Tuesday after the Congress spokesperson filed a complaint.
