ECoR gears up safety precautions for monsoon, flood situations

BHUBANESWAR, JUNE 30 /- The East Coast Railway (ECoR) has taken precautionary steps to protect the tracks during the monsoon to minimise the impact of heavy rains and ensure safe and smooth running of trains.

ECoR general manager Umesh Singh has directed the officials concerned to be on alert towards any incident caused by monsoon rain and flood situation near railway track for the safety of passengers and smooth train operations, an ECoR official said. Accordingly, the catch water drains and side drains have been cleared of silt, vegetation and other obstructions to ensure free flow of rain water. The waterways of bridges have also been cleared of vegetation and other obstructions.

Full Supply Level (FSL) in case of canals and Danger

Level (DL) for bridges have been drawn with bright red band across each pier adjacent to the abutment so as to be clearly visible to the patrolmen, stationery watchmen and drivers. Arrangements have been made to prevent stagnation of water on the track. In station yards, cross drains and longitudinal drains have been cleared to proper grades, said ECoR chief public relations officer J P Mishra.

ECoR is in constant touch with the Meteorological Department for weather alerts and proper mobilisation is being done to meet any situation, while officers and staff are kept on alert for attending to monsoon emergencies, he said. ECoR Control Office, which works round the clock, is keeping close liaison with Met Department and Disaster Management Cell and employees have been deputed at

flood prone areas for continuous monitoring and constant updates.

Patrolling of railway tracks has been arranged in the monsoon. They would protect the trains and passengers from any unusual occurrence. Stationary patrolmen and watchmen have been deployed at vulnerable locations. Mobile patrolmen have been deployed in vulnerable sections. Instructions have been issued that whenever there is heavy rain, the sectional gang men will organise patrolling of track to make sure that the track is safe for passage of trains and ensure protection at all locations where washouts or slips are likely to occur.

Steps have been taken to stock sufficient quantities of monsoon reserve materials like boulders, sand, cinder, quarry dust, ballast at identified locations.

Ramgarh lynching: Jharkhand CM asks police to take strong action against those involved

Prohibitory order imposed

RANCHI, JUNE 30 /- Jharkhand chief minister Raghubar Das today directed the police to take strict action against those involved in the lynching of a man in Ramgarh and an attack on a man in Giridih district.

Das told the police to arrest the culprits at the earliest so that they could be punished through fast-track courts, a government statement said. The chief minister said no one has the right to take law into their own hands and administration of law is above all. The guilty should not go scot-free, who

ever he might be, he said, adding a repeat of such incidents should be prevented. The chief minister said if incidents of cattle smuggling come to light, the officer-in-charge of the area concerned, DSP and other senior officials would face action. It is time for stern action, he said.

The Director General of Police, D K Pandey said that one of the 13 accused in the Ramgarh incident has been arrested while the 19 accused in the Giridih incident have been arrested. Along with CID, four special teams

have been set up to nab the culprits, he added. The chief minister chaired a meeting on law and order in Deogarh with senior officials. A man was beaten to death by a mob at Ramgarh yesterday on suspicion that he was carrying beef in his vehicle. A mob attacked a person on suspicion that he slaughtered a cow after allegedly finding the carcass of the animal near his house in Giridih district on June 27. Prohibitory orders preventing Assembly of more than four persons was today imposed here, a day after

the lynching incident triggered panic, officials said. On the basis of detailed reports received from subdivisional officer, Anant Kumar, the administration imposed prohibitory orders under CrPc section 144 in all the six blocks of Ramgarh, deputy commissioner Rajeshwari B said. The situation is tense but under control and additional security forces were deployed in identified points of the district. Inspector General of Police M L Meena said. Dependents of the deceased family

would be given Rs 20 lakh as compensation by the state government, she said. Meena, who visited Ramgarh and held meetings with senior police and administrative officials said that two FIRs were registered with the Ramgarh police station. One person has been arrested by the police and the police were conducting raids to nab the other accused named in the FIR. Kishore Kausal, superintendent of police, Ramgarh, said the report from forensic laboratory has not been received so far.

Assam to roll out Operation Muskan-III from today

GUWAHATI, JUNE 30 /- Assam government is all set to roll out the month-long Operation Muskan-III from Saturday to rescue and recover missing children.

A meeting chaired by T Y Das, additional chief secretary, home and political department, was held here today to chalk out the programme, which was a follow-up of earlier campaigns like Operation Smile-III and Operation Muskan-II, successful in the recovery of 40,000 children, an official release said.

All deputy commissioners have been directed to take all-out efforts for successful implementation of the campaign in their respective jurisdiction. They were directed to activate and sensitise district level

child welfare committees (CWCs) and take personal interest in ensuring the success for 'Operation Muskan-III'.

The meeting was attended by senior police officials, senior officials from social welfare, health, education, labour and welfare departments. The Centre has advised all states and union territories to extend cooperation during inter-state rescue operations; to ensure proper provision of ambulance, medicines, clothes, medical aid, professional translators, psychiatrists and shelter homes for rehabilitation/ reintegration will before the rescue operations and to ensure that such operations are conducted in strict compliance of the existing legal provisions, the release added.

WTI constructs guest house at Pangti in Nagaland

GUWAHATI, JUNE 30 /- Wildlife Trust of India (WTI) has constructed a guest house to be used as an eco-tourism resource in Pangti area of Nagaland's Wokha district to ensure conservation of the Amur Falcons which migrate to this area in winter.

WTI manager and project leader Dilip Deori formally handed over the keys of the guest house to Pangti Village Council chairman Jeothung S. Shitri in the presence of village headmen of three villages of Pangti, Asha and Sungro recently. He briefed the locals about the significance of the guest house and how it could benefit them. "On behalf of the Pangti people I would like to thank WTI for constructing this beautiful guest house. It will bring more visitors to Pangti and benefit people in the area in due course of time", Shitri said.

"The people of Pangti have played a piv-

otal role in ensuring safe passage for the migration migrants, the Amur Falcons", said Wokha divisional forest officer Zuthunglo Ezang. "The guest house will cater to the needs of tourists who visit the village during the great migration season and I am glad that WTI has supported the local community in this way", she said. The Village Council Members (VCM) provided the land for the construction in Pangti, which is a nodal village and the building's blueprint was finalised in consultation with the villagers an attempt was made to incorporate elements of the local Lotha architecture in the design.

The Wokha district of Nagaland is ground zero for the Amur Falcons who on their 15,000-mile migration from the Amur region of Russia, China and Mongolia to southern Africa, make a pit stop in Indian territory.

Arunachal Cong condemns recent incident at Delhi club

ITANAGAR, JUNE 30 /- The Arunachal Pradesh Congress Committee (APCC) today condemned the recent incident at a plush Delhi club where a woman was asked to leave the dining room for wearing a traditional Khassi outfit.

"The incident clearly indicates racism against the Khassi woman. Such attacks are alienating people from the Northeast instead of taking them along," the APCC said in a statement. "The diversity of the country cannot be dismissed by calling someone's attire as that of a maid, especially when the country is ruled by a party that swears by the teaching of Swami Vivekananda," the party added. The Meghalaya woman, Tailin Lyngdoh, was asked to leave the dining room of Delhi Golf Club because the club's staffers believed her traditional outfit looked like a maid's uniform.

3 bikers killed in Nalanda mishap

BIHARSHARIF, JUNE 30 /- Three bikers were killed in an accident here yesterday when they were run over by a speeding truck in Bihar's Nalanda district today.

Protesting against the incident, locals blocked the road and attacked a driver of a police vehicle. The incident occurred near Babu Bigha village on Ekangar Sarai-Islampur main road under the jurisdiction of Ekangar Sarai police station. A speeding truck coming from the opposite direction lost control and knocked down four bikers riding two motorcycles, Ekangar Sarai police station officer-in-charge Dinesh Malakar said. Three persons were killed on the spot while another was injured. The injured was admitted to Ekangar Sarai primary health centre, Malakar said. Two out of the three deceased persons were identified as Ravi Kumar and Arun Prasad. Both were residents of Babu Bigha village. The identity of the third person could not be ascertained till last reports came in. The truck driver managed to escape from the spot after the accident, the police officer said. Angry locals kept the bodies on the Ekangar Sarai-Islampur main road and blocked it, Malakar said. They also attacked one Munna, the driver of a police vehicle and injured him. The police was camping at the incident site till last reports came in.

Extra AC Coach for Uttarbanga Express

KOLKATA, JUNE 30 /- To clear the extra rush of passengers, one additional AC 2 Tier coach will be attached with 13447/13148 Uttarbanga Express from Sealdah on July 1 and from New Cooch Behar on July 2 for two months on temporary basis.

Karnan sent to Presidency jail

KOLKATA, JUNE 30 /- Arrested former Calcutta High Court judge CS Karnan has been released from the state-run SSKM hospital and sent back to Presidency jail hospital after his health condition improved.

"His health condition improved and we have decided to release him from the hospital. However, he requires medical supervision," a senior official of the SSKM hospital said. Karnan was released from the SSKM hospital yesterday night. He was

admitted there since June 22 after he had complained of chest pain and uneasiness. "He is currently at the Presidency correctional home (jail) hospital. Doctors there are keeping an eye on him," a senior official at the correctional home said. The former Calcutta High Court judge was sentenced to six months imprisonment on May 9 by the Supreme Court. He had remained untraceable till his arrest. The SC's seven-judge bench had held him guilty of contempt of court for his comments against the Chief Justice of India and other judges of the higher judiciary. Karnan had retired earlier this month.

31st anniversary of Mizo peace accord celebrated

AIZAWL, JUNE 30 /- The 31st anniversary of the signing of the historic Mizo peace accord between the Union government and the erstwhile underground Mizo National Front (MNF) was celebrated today in Mizoram.

All government offices and educational institutions remained close as the day was declared a public holiday. Though no official function was organised by the state government, the opposition MNF organised meetings in different parts of the state. A press statement issued by the Peace Accord MNF Returnee Association (PAMRA) said that of the 572 MNF cadres who came overground due to the accord, 150 people have died since 1986 till date. The Mizo Accord was signed on June 30, 1986 ushering in an era of peace after 20 years of violence

and disturbance in the state. Meanwhile, Mizoram unit of BJP has submitted a memorandum to state Governor Lt Gen (Retd) Nirbhay Sharma asking him to dissolve the Congress-led Chakma Autonomous District Council (CADC), a press statement issued by the party today said.

The statement said that the BJP state unit leaders submitted the memorandum to Sharma yesterday saying that there had been a constitutional crisis in the CADC after resignation of six executive members which was a clear case of no confidence against the executive council headed by chief executive member (CEM) Tongchongyia. The BJP also alleged that the Congress government in the CADC was "corruption ridden and failed" in many fronts. (PTI)

PATNA, JUNE 30 /- Bihar chief minister Nitish Kumar on Thursday made a fervent appeal to people to do away with the practice of child marriage, the main reason for stunted growth of children in the state.

Bihar has a problem of stunted growth of children, the main reason for which is child marriage," Nitish said addressing a function after inaugurating the newly constructed Uderasthan

barrage in Jehanabad. "The should be no marriage before a boy attains the age of 21 years and a girl 18 years. When a girl marries before the age, she becomes pregnant, her child would be afflicted with numerous diseases," he said.

Stressing on the need to get rid of social maladies prevailing in the society, the chief minister said that after inaugurating the newly constructed Uderasthan

Train services hit due to protest by tribals in West Midnapore

KOLKATA, JUNE 30 /- Train services were today affected in Kharagpur and Adra division of southern railway due to 'rail roko' call given by Bharat Jyakat Majhi Pargana Mahal (BJMPM), the largest outfit of tribals in West Midnapore, SER sources said. The outfit has called the 'rail roko' to protest the 'Hool Divas' not being properly celebrated in the state. They also demanded that importance should be given to their Alchiki language. June 30 is commemorated as Hool Divas by tribals in memory of

their 30,000 ancestors who were martyred during the Santal Rebellion of 1855-56. The services have been affected since 6.30 am today. Agitations have been organised at Nekurseni and Khamasul stations of Kharagpur division, and Chhatna, Madhukunda, Garhadrubeswar and Salboni stations of Adra division, the sources said. Three trains, Kharagpur-Hatia passenger, Kharagpur-Tatanagar passenger and Adra-Mednapur passenger, have been cancelled.
