Anatomy of CPI's Munnar meet boycott

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: Tension between the CPM and CPI, its principal ally in the Left Democratic Front (LDF) Government, has flared up once again, causing fresh concern in LDF circles. The latest faceoff follows the CPI's decision to boycott a meeting of political parties convened by Revenue Principal Secretary P H Kurien to discuss the eviction drive in Munnar. The meeting became necessary in the wake of a memorandum submitted jointly by various political parties to the Chief Minister.

Revenue Minister E Chandrashekarhan had refused to convene the meeting although he had been asked by Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan to do so. The minister, who belongs to the CPI, felt such a meeting, even as the eviction operations in Munnar are going apace, would create a wrong impression and give an excuse to the encroachers to continue their illegal activities.

However, ignoring the opposition, the CM directed the Revenue Principal Secretary to call the meeting on July 1.

Evidently unhappy about the CM's directive, the CPI executive, which met yesterday, asked the Revenue Minister to ignore the meeting.

The fast-paced developments have brought to the fore the differences between the CPI and the CPM on the ongoing drive against evictions in Munnar. While the CPI favours an all-out drive to oust the encroachers, the CPM, especially the Idukki district leadership of the party headed by Power Minister M M Mani, is opposed to it.

The CPI-CPM differences are not limited to the Munnar eviction drive. The CPI has taken strong exception to

the 'brutal' lathi-charge against the residents of Puthuvype, who are agitating against the location of an LPG storage plant there. No less a person than CPI state secretary Kanam Rajendran has strongly criticized the justification of the lathi-charge by the police chief on the ground that militants had infiltrated the ranks of the agitators!

On the other hand, the CPM has maintained a deafening silence on the police attack, with the Chief Minister refusing to concede the CPI's demand for action against the guilty police officers. The CM has also ruled out abandonment of the LPG project on the ground that scrapping it would send wrong signals to future investors. The CM's statement has come as a surprise as the agitators are not seeking abandonment of the storage plant project. All that they are asking for is to shift the plant from Puthuvype, one of the most densely populated areas, to a less populated area.

The CPI has, however, hardened its stance on the issue, with Kanam trying a scathing attack against the Indian Oil Corporation which selected Puthuvype for their plant. The authorities who took the decision should have their heads examined, Kanam said, adding that no development ignoring the fears and concerns of the people should take place.

The CPI's opposition has had a partial effect as the Government has asked IOC to suspend their work till the experts committee, set up by the government, submitted its report on whether the IOC has violated environmental rules in going ahead with the project.

The people of Puthuvype are said to be skeptical, however, about the committee report. They feel the committee is unlikely to come out with a report against the location of the plant in Puthuvype. Their reasoning: as the CM

has openly said that all necessary safety measures have been taken and there is no cause for concern, the committee would not have the nerve to prepare an adverse report.

But the surface calm can be shattered any time with tension running high in the area. One thing is for sure: if the report goes against their wishes, the residents of Puthuvype would revive their agitation with renewed vigour. And it is not as if they lack support. As many as 20 mass organizations have lent their full support to their agitation. Whatever the outcome, Puthuvype has lost its obscurity status, and hogged the headlines. (IPA)

Mirwaiz Umar Farooq placed under house arrest

SRINAGAR, JUNE 30 /- Separatist Hurriyat Conference leader Mirwaiz Umar Farooq was today placed under house arrest as he was heading towards Jamia Masjid in Nowhatta area of the city for the Friday prayers.

A posse of policemen stopped Mirwaiz from leaving his residence and informed him that he has been placed under house arrest, a spokesman of the Hurriyat chairman said.

He said the Hurriyat leader was heading to Jamia Masjid for delivering a sermon ahead of the Friday prayers.

A police official said the step was taken as there was apprehension of law and order problems in view of the protest call given by the Hurriyat after Friday prayers.

Meanwhile, authorities today imposed restrictions in parts of Srinagar as a precautionary measure against protests by separatist groups over the US decision to declare Hizbul Mujahideen chief Syed Salahuddin a 'global terrorist'. (PTI)

Agromet bulletin for farmers

PORT BLAIR, JUNE 30 /- The Central India Agricultural Research Institute has released the agromet bulletin for farmers for the period from July 1-5, 2017. In the bulletin, CIARI forecast cloudy weather with light to moderate rainfall in the next five days. In South Andaman 77 mm of rainfall in North and Middle Andaman 50 mm of rainfall and in Nicobar Island 95 mm of rainfall is expected during the period. The maximum temperature will be 29 to 32 degree centigrade with minimum temperature of 23 to 26 degree centigrade, whereas the maximum and minimum relative humidity is expected to be in the range of 78 to 81 % and 72 to 77 %, respectively in Andaman and Nicobar Islands. Wind speed of 2 to 29 kmph is expected from South Westery direction.

Farmers in South Andaman have been advised to identify the rodent movement track in paddy field and place rodent trap accordingly to avoid the losses during ripening of the crops, avoid stagnation of water in vegetable field to prevent incidence of damping off diseases, make ridges and transplant the banana suckers as the soil condition is conducive and remove the wet litter from poultry shed and put dry fresh litter for enhanced production and to avoid growth of any pathogens. Air India to run flight on Bhopal-Lucknow route

BHOPAL, JUNE 30 /- Air India area manager of Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, Vishnu Acharya today said Air India a subsidiary of the national carrier, will operate a new flight on the Bhopal-Lucknow route from July 5 onwards. Acharya said flights to various destinations would be operated from Bhopal in the coming days after the induction of new aircraft in A's fleet.

"A daily flight from Bhopal to Lucknow would be operated from July 5 with ATR-72 aircraft. New flights would be started from Bhopal after the induction of new aircraft in A's fleet," he said. The flight would take off at 11.50 am from the Raja Bhoj Airport and reach Lucknow at 1.45 pm. In return journey, it will take off from Lucknow at 2.15 pm and reach Bhopal at 3.55 pm. The flight, connecting the capital cities of Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh would be helpful in boosting tourism in both the states, he said.
