

CIARI distributes TLF rice seeds to farmers in South, N&M Andaman

PORT BLAIR, JUNE 11 /- The ICAR, CIARI along with the Krishi Vigyan Kendra South, North & Middle Andaman and Department of Agriculture, A & N Administration has launched frontline demonstrations of promising high yielding varieties of rice at North, Middle & South Andaman during its Seed Day celebration recently involving PRI members at selected location in an area of 0.40 ha each. Altogether 17 quintals of TLF rice seeds of high yielding rice varieties were distributed which will cover a total area of 85 ha, and subsequently enhanced both the Seed Replacement Rate (SRR) and Variety Replacement Rate (VRR) in the area in due course after adoption. The first such programme was inaugurated by Pradhan, Mr Satish Singh as the chief guest at Rangat, in presence of Pradhan, Dasrathpur, Nimbutala, Parnashah, Nimbutala, PRI members and a large gathering of 142 farmers representing 16 Panchayats covering 64 villages including Long Island. The chief guest appreciated the effort taken by the team in providing the prom-



ising varieties of rice in time with its technical know-how and dohow. Dr. S. K. Zamir Ahmed Principal Scientist and Co-Nodal Officer sensitized the participants on the objective of transfer of technology from Lab to land in FLDs mode jointly and introduced the seed chain linkage by farmers to farmers as extension methodology to strengthen the availability of seeds by the farmers, for the farmers for the next kharif and likewise leading to its spread to the peer groups. Rain-related incidents in Kerala: Minister

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM, JUNE 11 /- Torrential rains accompanied by gusty winds that lashed parts of Kerala for the past two days after the monsoon set in on May 29 has claimed 16 lives so far and caused damage to crops worth over Rs 6 crore, state minister for revenue E Chandrasekharan said here today. As per a preliminary estimate, 1,108 houses were partially damaged and 61 fully destroyed in the rains, while 122 people from 33 families have been shifted to relief camps. Chandrasekharan told the state Assembly, Agriculture loss was estimated at Rs 6.34 crore in 188.41 hectares of farm land, the minister said to a submission by Leader of Opposition Ramesh Chennithala, adding the calamity has affected 2,784 farmers. The families of the deceased would be given Rs four lakh from the State Disaster Relief Fund, he said adding compensation also would be given to people whose houses have been damaged. Control rooms have been set up in all districts to coordinate emergency operations in the event of any rain-related incidents, Chandrasekharan said.

The accident took place on the Agra-Lucknow Expressway when one of the buses broke down after it ran out of fuel following which the nine students came out and were strolling on the roadside, an official told newsmen.

Goa church demands withdrawal of coastal regulation rules

PANAJI, JUNE 11 /- The Goa church has demanded withdrawal of the draft Coastal Regulation Zone (CRZ) notification 2018, saying it seems like "guidelines to facilitate projects rather than protecting the environment". The Centre for Responsible Tourism (CRT), an initiative of the Goa Church, claimed that the notification regularises violations to CRZ and opens way for further depredation of the coastal ecology and environment. CRT's general secretary Father Freddy Braganza, in his letter sent on June 9 to Arvind Nautiyal, director, ministry of environment, forest and climate change, has raised objections over the proposed amendments in the notification. The ministry had released the draft notification on April 18 seeking comments and suggestions from general public within 60 days. "The way the draft is framed seems more like guidelines to facilitate projects, rather than to protect the environment. In view of this, the draft CRZ notification 2018 should be categorically withdrawn," CRT said in its five-page letter. The draft notification, in terms of its character and contents, in the nature and course of preparation, and the way it is being thrust across, is a perfect assault on the environment and livelihood, it alleged. "The proposed notification regularises violations to CRZ and opens way for further depredation of our coastal ecology and environment," it said, adding that draft violates the existing CRZ norms. Father Braganza demanded that the ministry should prepare and enact the draft through democratic consultation with all stakeholders, especially the fishing community. A copy of the legislative should be framed that would ensure conservation of the coastal environment, ecology, and natural resources and protect traditional livelihood options, CRT said. "Stringent measures should be in place for CRZ violations," it demanded.

High wind wave alert

PORT BLAIR, JUNE 11 /- The INCOIS Observatory, Hyderabad has forecast high waves in the range of 3.5 - 4.5 meters during 5.30 pm on 11-06-2018 to 11.30 pm of 13-06-2018 along the west coast of Andaman Islands from Ten Degree Channel to Coco Channel. Current speeds may vary between 102 - 151 cm/sec. Due to strong southwest monsoon current, strong southwesterly wind speed between 45 and 55 kmph and rough to very rough seas are likely along and off Andaman & Nicobar coasts. In Nicobar, high waves in the range of 3.5 - 3.7 meters are expected during 17:30 hours on 11-06-2018 to 23:30 hours of 13-06-2018 along the west coast of Nicobar Islands from Ten Degree Channel to Great Channel. Current speeds vary between 71 - 86 cm/sec. Due to strong Southwest monsoon current, strong Southwesterly wind speed between 45 and 55 kmph and rough to very rough seas are likely along and off Andaman & Nicobar coasts. Fishermen have been advised not to venture into the sea. The general public have been advised to take precautionary measures and contact the State Control Room, District Control Room and Emergency Operation Centres in case of any emergency.
