

'Advanced Rural Poultry Production' training at ICAR-CIARI

PORT BLAIR, MAR 12/- / A 6-day hands-on training programme on Advanced Rural Poultry Production was conducted by Division of Animal Science, ICAR-CIARI, Port Blair from March 5 to 10. A total of 54 farmers including 44 female and 10 tribal farmers participants of South Andaman and Little Andaman underwent this training which was funded by and collaborated with Central Poultry Development Organisation, Bengaluru. Dr. A. Kundu, Director, ICAR-CIARI was the Chairman; Dr. T. Sujatha was Course Director and Dr. Jai Sunder was co-ordinator. Dr. Debasis Bhattacharya, Dr. M. S. Kundu, Dr. A. K. Dey, Dr. Perumal P. and Dr. K. Muniswamy were Course Coordinators. It was facilitated by Dr. Nagresh Ram, Dr. N. C. Choudhury and Dr. Zacharia George of KVK, ICAR-CIARI, South Andaman. The training was both interactive and participatory.



loan were taught, demonstrated and participants were given practice on brooding arrangement, vaccination, handling and candling of hatchable eggs. Exposure visit was arranged to poultry farm cum hatchery unit at Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services, KVK, Port Blair and farmers' fields. Dr. Amol Roy, SVO (Retired) delivered guest lectures on scientific management of rural poultry. As part of International Women's day celebrations, farm women were also sensitized on women empowerment on agricultural practices.

As per the result of pre and post evaluation, the knowledge level of participants on goat and poultry farming was increased 2-3 folds and they gave feedback that this type of programme was very much informative and useful to set up their carrier in livestock farming. Dr. A. Kundu appreciated such programmes on rural poultry farming for the farm women. He motivated them on employment generation and entrepreneurship development through small scale of rural poultry farming. He stressed upon integrated and organic farming system. He recommended Vanaraja birds as suitable birds for alternative poultry farming.

Type-Test for Recruitment in PBMC

PORT BLAIR, MAR 12/- / The first Type-Test on Computer has been scheduled at the National Informatics Centre (NIC), Andaman State Unit, GPOA Complex, Ranchi Basthi, Port Blair on March 24 and 25, i.e. Saturday & Sunday. A total of 15 sets of Test Papers for the Type-Test have been uploaded on the website www.and.nic.in. The candidate will get either of the set for the Type-Test. However the particular set will be decided through draw of lots, immediately prior to commencement of the Type-Test. The draw of lots will be conducted by the Observer in presence of the Centre Supervisor and candidates.

The Type-Test will be in MS word on Computer. This being skill test of qualifying nature, each of the shortlisted candidate will be given maximum three attempts to qualify the Type-Test. The candidate who qualifies in the first Type-Test need not appear in subsequent attempt. The dates of subsequent two Type-Tests will be announced in due course. There will be a minimum 15 days gap between two tests. The fresh Admission certificate/Hall Tickets for the Type-Test can be downloaded from the website www.and.nic.in. Candidates are required to reach the Centre at least 30 minutes before the schedule time and bring a copy of Hall Ticket along with any original photo identity Card like Aadhar Card, Driving Licence, Islander I-Card or Election I-Card etc.

BJP's DP Vats files nomination for RS seat from Haryana

CHANDIGARH, MARCH 12/- / Retired Lt General D P Vats, who was chosen by the BJP as its nominee for the lone Rajya Sabha seat in Haryana, today filed his nomination papers. The seat is being vacated by Congress member Shadi Lal Batra. While filing his nomination, 67-year-old Vats was accompanied by chief minister Manohar Lal Khattar, many Cabinet colleagues including Ram Bilas Sharma and Abhimanyu, and BJP legislators from the state. The ruling BJP has 47 MLAs in the 90-member House and it is set to win the seat comfortably. The INLD has 19 members, the Congress 17, the BSP and the SAD one each. There are 5 Independents. Vats, who hailed from Hisar, had also served as director and commandant of the prestigious Armed Forces Medical College, Pune.

Vats served as chairman of the Haryana Public Service Commission between May 2011 and April 2012 during the Bhupinder Singh Hooda-led Congress government in the state.

Common man, police officers not safe in Karnataka, says BJP spokesperson

BENGALURU, MARCH 12/- / Demanding an immediate meeting between IPS officers Association and the chief secretary, BJP spokesperson Suresh Kumar today alleged that the common man and police officers are not safe in Karnataka, "which chief minister Siddaramaiah claims is the number one state."

"The common man and police officers are not safe in Karnataka, claimed to be number one state by chief minister. It is very sad that police officers are not feeling safe in the system," he said in a video clip released to the press. The police system is under strain...the ruling party for its survival and to protect its followers does not have a right to destroy a system and an institution," he alleged.

Suresh said the Association had written to chief secretary Ratna Prabha asking her to convene a meeting of all IPS officers and some retired IPS officers, "to discuss and evolve a strategy considering their immediate goal of a fair and free election and long-term goal of imbuing strong professional values in the service and police force." Assembly polls are due in Karnataka this year. Each and every sentence in the letter, which raised relevant issues at the right time, would be endorsed by all citizens of the state, a confident BJP spokesperson said and added that it started with the assault on IAS officer Rashmi and the latest was the attack on Karnataka Lokayukta Vishwanath Shetty.

Six police commissioners in four years for Bengaluru city was a telling comment on the system, Kumar said. It was high time the chief secretary agreed to the meet and thrashed out issues to give confidence to the public as ultimately their welfare was most important for any administration, he said.

Disquiet over posting of SI as SHO MB

MAYBUNDER, MAR 12/- / The former Pramukh of Panchayat Samiti, Mayabunder N&M Andaman, Mr. Abdul Siddique, in a letter to the Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India has underlined the disquiet in the Police Force in the N&M Andaman District due to the unusual move by the Police authorities in appointing a junior-most Sub-inspector Mr. Rakesh Singh to the post of Station House Officer at Police Station, Mayabunder. The letter states that the A & N Police department has appointed Inspector rank officers as Station House Officers in police stations of Campbell Bay, Car Nicobar, Hungrybun, Pahargang, Diglipur etc., but this case has set many tongues wagging and the causing discomfiture to senior officers, who in spite of being seniors have to take orders from a junior. Mr. Siddique claims in his communication that although the senior officers are unhappy they refrain from placing their grievances for fear of being reprimanded by higher ups in the Police force.

Police register FIR against Cardinal George Alencherry

by Shine Varghese from Chertala. Shine had moved the high court, saying that the Ernakulam Central Police had not registered an FIR on his complaint against the cardinal and others over the land deals.

They were named in the complaint alleging criminal conspiracy, criminal breach of trust and cheating in sale of over three acres of land, worth crores of rupees, belonging to the Ernakulam-Angamaly Archdiocese.

Alencherry, who is also the major archbishop of the archdiocese, is the first accused in the case, police said.

They have been charged under various sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC), including sections 120B (criminal conspiracy), 405 and 406 (criminal breach of trust), and 420 (cheating and dishonestly inducing delivery of property), police said.

Police have registered the FIR after a section of the Syro-Malabar Church faithful questioned the delay in filing it and threatened to move the Kerala High Court on the matter. Police also secured legal advice before registering the FIR. The cardinal and the other accused moved separate appeals in the high court, submitting that the order of the single judge and the conclusions arrived at by him were unsustainable in law and facts.

Earlier, a six member church committee, which probed the alleged irregularities, said it had found numerous instances of violation of canon and civil laws. It had recommended necessary action against those responsible.

The three persons on Sunday night entered the store posing as customers and attacked shop owner Surendra Kumar while one of them held the shopkeeper at gunpoint, a senior police officer said. Unfazed, Kumar fought back despite one of the accused opening fire at him, the police officer said, adding the bullet missed Kumar and he raised alarm to alert passersby.

Four-member gang backs school student to death

HYDERABAD, MARCH 12/- / A 12th standard student was allegedly chased and hacked to death by a four-member gang here today, police said. The incident happened around 3.30 am when the deceased, identified as Sudheer E (19), was on his way to write his examination, they said. Police said Sudheer got off his two-wheeler when he was attacked and boarded a bus, but the gang pulled him out and hacked him to death on the roadside, Assistant Commissioner of Police (Kukatpally Division) N Bujanga Rao said.
