

Varun counters Modi govt, says don't deport Rohingya Muslims

NEW DELHI, SEPT 26 /-/-/ Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) MP Varun Gandhi's appeal to provide shelter to the "illegal" Rohingya Muslim refugees residing in India, hasn't gone down well with the government, with minister of state for home affairs Hansraj Ahir saying, national interest should come first.

Gandhi, in an opinion piece published in a Hindi daily, called for not deporting Rohingyas from India, saying that the country should continue to provide them

shelter. In his article, the BJP MP urged the government to look back into India's rich history of helping the refugees and help the Rohingyas. As the Member of Parliament from Sultanpur in Uttar Pradesh, came under severe criticism, he took to Twitter to express his views on his article. "As for the Rohingyas, I've called for empathy leading potentially to asylum, while vetting each applicant for national security concerns," Gandhi tweeted. "My recent piece focused

primarily on defining India's asylum policy, with clear demarcations on how we would accept refugees," his another tweet said. Union home minister Rajnath Singh had last week reiterated that government is firm in its decision to deport Rohingyas Muslim refugees to Myanmar. The Centre has urged the Supreme Court not to interfere in the Rohingya issue as the move to deport them was a policy decision in the country's larger interests and that some of

them were linked to Pakistani spy agency ISI and other terrorist groups. The government had informed the Parliament on August 9 that according to available data, more than 14,000 Rohingyas, registered with the UNHCR, were staying in India. However, some inputs indicate that around 40,000 undocumented Rohingyas were staying in India, mostly in Jammu, Hyderabad, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Delhi-NCR and Rajasthan regions.

3 more Oman nationals in police net in contract marriage case

HYDERABAD, SEPT 26 /-/-/ The Hyderabad Police today arrested three more Oman nationals along with two locals including a chief Qazi in connection with the alleged trafficking of minor girls from the city under the guise of 'contract marriages' with elderly men from Gulf countries. Omani national Al Sheyad Sulaiman, 70 years, who claimed before police that he came to the city for medical treatment, was found to have actually come here for his marriage

and was looking for minor girls, deputy commissioner of police (South Zone) V Satyanarayana told newsmen here. A broker from Oman identified as Al Shayadi Mohammed Khalfan had brought Sulaiman here to perform his marriage and investigation is underway to find out other victims who were trapped by him and trafficked to Oman and other Gulf countries, the DCP said. The third Omani national Al Awdi Yasir, who married a city woman, had

brought one visually challenged 75-year-old Oman national Abdullah Mubarak, who had already married ten times before for another marriage, the senior police official said. Along with the three Omani nationals, police also arrested chief Qazi Ali Abdullah Rifai, who allegedly provided girls to foreign nationals by maintaining a network of brokers including women to search girls from poor families of the city, Satyanarayana said.

Gujarat polls

Rahul hits campaign trail in Patidar belt

JAMNAGAR, SEPT 26 /-/-/ Eyeing the support of the influential Patel community, Congress president Rahul Gandhi today hit the campaign trail in the Patidar-dominated areas of poll-bound Gujarat.

Some members of the National Students Union of India (NSUI), the party's student wing, greeted him as he left Jamnagar for Rajkot this morning. The Congress leader urged the NSUI members to work hard to bring the party to power in Gujarat. Taking a dig at BJP governments in the state and at the Centre, Gandhi said if the Congress was voted to power, his party's government would function from Gujarat and not on orders from Delhi. On his way, at Falla village in Jamnagar, locals welcomed him by raising the slogan 'Jai Patidar, Jai Sardar'.

People were also seen wearing caps with the same slogan. Gandhi, who is on the second day of his three-day tour of Gujarat, is slated to visit several villages and towns, such as Dhol and Tankara that have a sizable Patel population. The Congress is hoping to get the support of this decisive vote bank during the polls due later this year.

On Monday, on the first day of his visit to the state, Gandhi was greeted by Hardik Patel, leader of the Patel quota agitation. "A warm welcome to Congress vice president Rahul Gandhi in Gujarat," Patel tweeted in Hindi on Monday when Gandhi landed at Dwaraka. Patel had earlier hinted that he may consider supporting the Congress in the Assembly polls to achieve the goal of reservation to the Patel community under OBC quota.

Rahul had attacked Prime Minister Narendra Modi over issues like note ban, GST, farm policies and 'Gujarat model' of development, during his campaign from Dwaraka to Jamnagar yesterday. He also expressed confidence about winning the upcoming Assembly elections, claiming that there was a strong undercurrent in favour of the Congress in Gujarat and the people regretted having voted for the BJP.

ED books principal secy to former Haryana CM Hooda

NEW DELHI, SEPT 26 /-/-/ The Enforcement Directorate (ED) today said it has registered a case of money laundering against Murari Lal Tayal, who was principal secretary to then Haryana chief minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda, and three family members.

An ED official, requesting anonymity, told IANS: "We have registered a case of money laundering against Tayal and three family members taking cognisance of the CBI FIR." The CBI had on September 4 registered a case against Tayal, his wife Savita, son Kartik and daughter Malvika and a firm Kappac Pharma Ltd on the charge of possessing disproportionate assets. A case was registered by the CBI under the Prevention of Corruption Act in

connection with an ongoing probe into a land deal scam in Gurugram's Manesar.

The CBI said its investigation into the Manesar land scam case registered in August 2015 revealed that Tayal had acquired movable and immovable assets worth Rs 17.5 crore in his own name and those of his family by corrupt and illegal means and by misusing his official position. Tayal was principal secretary to Hooda from March 6, 2008, to October 31, 2009. According to officials, Tayal played an important role in various important administrative decisions, including release of land in Manesar which was in the process of acquisition by Haryana State Industrial and Infrastructure Corporation through the Industries Department.

2 tigers found dead in MP forest areas

UMARIA/SEONI, SEPT 26 /-/-/ A tigress and a male cub died in different forest areas of Madhya Pradesh in the last 24 hours, officials said today. A two-year-old tigress was found dead in a well in the area of Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve (BTR) in Umaria district. "The tigress might have fallen into the well while running away from an attack by wild animals and drowned," BTR's ranger Vijay Shankar Shivastava

said. The forest department was probing the feline's death from various angles, he said. The well is located in Mihli village, which was included in the BTR's core area some years back. Besides, a mutilated carcass of a male cub was yesterday found in the Karmahiri range of Pench National Park in Seoni district. Shubhbranjana Sen, said it seemed as if a powerful male tiger active in the area

had attacked the cub. "The pug marks of a tiger were spotted at the site. The marks of dragging the cub were also seen. The post-mortem report indicated that the cub's skull bones were broken," he said. There was no sign of poisoning at the site, he said. A tigress was recently spotted with its three cubs in the area. The dead cub might be one of them, Pench National Park's deputy director K K Gurwani said.

UP govt initiates work to stop flow of garbage in Ganga

LUCKNOW SEPT 26 /-/-/ A massive work plan has been initiated to ensure that garbage and waste stop flowing into the River Ganga before the 2019 'Ardh Kumbh', chief minister Yogi Adityanath today said. The river flows through 25 districts of Uttar Pradesh. "Before the 2019 Prayag (Allahabad) Ardhkumbh, even a single drain or garbage will flow into the River Ganga... a large scale work plan has got underway to ensure this," the chief minister said at a programme organised here by the Isha Foundation.

"A work plan worth Rs 30,000 crore has been started under the Prime Minister's 'Namami Gange' project to make the Ganga and its tributaries 'swirl, nirmal' (ever flowing and clean)", Adityanath said. "In the coming two years no one will be allowed to release

garbage or waste in the river and treatment plants will be set up at different places to first treat the drainage before it is allowed to flow into the river," he said. "In the first phase we have resolved to make all villages falling on the river's banks open defecation free (ODF) and have also succeeded in it," the chief minister said in the presence of founder of the Isha Foundation, Sadguru Jaggi Vasudev.

Referring to Sadguru's 'Save the Rivers' campaign, the chief minister said that it was not just a campaign or a slogan but an attempt to save the human creation. A vast plantation drive has also been launched in the areas falling on the banks of the River Ganga.

"I myself had gone to Garh Mukteshwar for I... all ministers,

MPs, MLAs took part at different places... officials of all departments, administration took part. We have planted six crore saplings in the state... this work was been done in different phases," Yogi said.

The chief minister said the practice of planting eucalyptus has been stopped and instead people are being encouraged to plant peepul, mango, bargad, neem, bel or medicinal plants or plants having religious significance.

Hailing the 'Rally for Rivers' programme, he said the new UP government has already started implementing programmes aimed at this. "The government has started the project to treat the waste flowing into Gomti in Lucknow so as to save the river, the project for it has already started," he added.

2002 Naroda Gam case SIT judge to visit riots spot on Oct 5

Ahmedabad, Sept 26 /-/-/ The judge of the special SIT court hearing the 2002 Naroda Gam massacre case today said he will visit the site of the incident on October 5 to understand the area's topography and verify the claims of witnesses. The court of special SIT judge P B Desai today decided on the date after the special investigation team's officer, Himanshu Shukla, who was asked to remain present in the court today, said he will be free after October 3. Shukla, who is currently the superintendent of police of Gujarat's Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS), was the investigating officer in the case. Judge Desai said that the lawyers of SIT, accused and victims will accompany him but he will be allowed there when he visits the site on October 5.

Desai asked the police to submit parts of the panchama, which carries description of the areas in Naroda Gam where the incident took place, so that he could decide based on the same as to which parts of the area he will need to visit. The SIT had on Monday suggested the court to visit the site of the incident to get a better idea about it and verify witnesses' claims. An application was filed jointly by the lawyers representing the SIT, accused and witnesses.

Andhra CM's pep talk to IAS officers

DEHRADUN, SEPT 26 /-/-/ The Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officers have a key role to play in building a developed India and they can do wonders if they learn continuously, Andhra Pradesh chief minister N Chandrababu Naidu has said. Addressing senior IAS officers, who had gathered at the prestigious Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration in Mussoorie near here, he said he still considers himself as a student. "Those who can learn continuously can do wonders... I learn from society, common man and administrators like you," Naidu told the officers yesterday during the inaugural session of 11th round of a three-week mandatory mid-career training programme for them. Talking about the three advantages India can make the most of in pursuit of its development goals, Naidu spoke of demographic dividend, large English speaking population and information technology. Another factor, he said, which is sure to work in the country's favour is a stable government at the Centre. "After some years, we have a stable government under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi," Naidu said. "One out of four IT professionals in the world is an Indian and out of every four Indian IT professionals, one is from Andhra Pradesh," he said. Highlighting how technology can help in the country's overall development, the chief minister presented the case study of Andhra Pradesh and spoke about various technology related reforms being implemented in the state.

Madras HC orders TN govt to withhold salaries of officials over non-payment of rent

CHENNAI, SEPT 26 /-/-/ The Madras High Court has directed the Tamil Nadu government not to disburse the salaries of the state revenue secretary, a district collector and another official over failure to pay the rent of a taluk office premises here.

Justice S Vaidyanathan recently passed the order on a writ petition filed by Parvita Shaikath, owner of the premises from where the Madhavaram taluk office is functioning since 2009. The Judge clarified that until the lease agreement containing the periodical revision of the lease amount is entered into and the arrears of rent as on date are cleared, the secretary to government, revenue department, district collector of Thiruvallur and the tahsildar (revenue officer) of Madhavaram taluk office shall not draw any salary. Allowing the petition, the judge said, "The arrears of rent had to be paid and the lease agreement has got to be entered into between the petitioner and the respondents and the petitioner being an old Muslim lady aged about 67 years, driving her from pillar to post is not justified.... The action of the respondents on the issue is perfunctory."

"Hence, this court finds that there is prima-facie substance in the contentions of the petitioner..." it said. The petitioner submitted that in December 2009, the revenue authorities had approached her to take the property on rent for the purpose of establishing a taluk office in Madhavaram. Following talks, it was agreed that a monthly rent of Rs 1,20,000 will be paid for letting out the premises, she said. Though initially the petitioner was apprehensive about letting out the premises to the state government, however, on an assurance given by the revenue officials that the lease agreement would be entered into, the petitioner had given consent for the same. On December 22, 2009, however, the tahsildar had entered the premises and took possession of the same stating that the establishment of taluk office was of great urgency, the petitioner said.

Further, an acknowledgement for taking on lease the premises was given by signing the letter issued by her, she claimed. The revenue inspector had also issued a letter confirming the functioning of the taluk office on the premises of the petitioner with effect from December 23, 2009.
