

**Pakshelling:
Situation along
LoC 'very bad',
says deputy CM**

JAMMU, JAN 30 /-- There was uproar in the Jammu and Kashmir assembly today as members, including those from the BJP and the CPM, raised the issue of Pakistan shelling along the Line of Control, forcing deputy chief minister Dr Nirmal Singh to describe the situation as "very bad".

Dr Singh said that administration has been directed to provide safe shelters and other facilities to people who have migrated from LoC area in Rajouri. During the Question Hour in the Assembly, BJP MLA Ravinder Raina said there is heavy firing and shelling going on along LoC in my Noushera constituency in which people are suffering and migration of the people have taken place. He said schools have been shut and houses suffered damages in the border areas and called for reply from the government to this urgent situation.

The BJP MLA demanded sending a ministerial team to assess the situation in Noushera sector. He was supported by CPM member M Tarigami and members of BJP. Replying on the issue, deputy chief minister said that "situation is very bad along LoC due to Pakistan shelling. As a result of the shelling, migration has taken place." He said that administration has been directed to provide necessary facilities, safe shelters and ensure safety for people along LoC.

Fourteen people, including seven children, have been killed and over 70 others injured in intense shelling by Pakistan along the International Border (IB) in Jammu, Kathua and Samba districts, and along LoC in Poonch and Rajouri districts from January 18 to 22, leading to the displacement of thousands of border residents.

Over 300 schools along LoC and IB were closed last week as a precautionary measure in view of the firing. On Monday also, Pakistani troops violated ceasefire in the Uri sector of Jammu and Kashmir by firing towards Indian posts.

Gehlot sees clean sweep for Cong in Rajasthan by-polls

JAIPUR, JAN 30 /-- Former Rajasthan chief minister Ashok Gehlot has claimed that Congress will emerge as winner in bypolls conducted in Ajmer and Alwar Lok Sabha constituencies and Mandalgarh Assembly seat in the state on Monday.

Congress will win by-polls conducted on all the three seats, Gehlot said talking to newsmen in Kota today. State election department has made arrangements for counting scheduled on February 1 for all the three seats. Information of all rounds of counting will be available on department's website, a spokesman said. By-polls were necessitated in these three seats due to the deaths of the sitting lawmakers.

UP Speaker mulls 'Best Legislator Award' for MLAs

LUCKNOW, JAN 30 /-- In a bid to infuse discipline among legislators, Uttar Pradesh Assembly Speaker Hriday Narayan Dixit is contemplating institution of a 'Best Legislator Award' on the lines of the honour given to MPs. If the proposal goes ahead, Uttar Pradesh will become the first state to institute such an award.

Stung by frequent derailment of proceedings by agitated members, Dixit told news agency PTI that his main aim will be to ensure discipline in the House, whose Budget Session commences on February 8. "To encourage legislators to follow parliamentary etiquette and norms, we will contemplate on institution of Best Legislator Award on the lines of Best Parliamentarian Award. This

**Yogi promises strict action against trouble makers in Kasganj
Giriraj feels the violence was pre-planned**

LUCKNOW, JAN 30 /-- Chief minister Yogi Adityanath today broke his silence on Kasganj violence promising action against those involved even as politics brewed over the clashes with Union minister Giriraj Singh claiming that media would have chosen a "different" line if the killed youth was from the majority community.

Another BJP hardliner Vinay Katiyar, known for his controversial utterances, also waded in the row saying there were some "miscreants who support Pakistan" who could go to any extent to defy the tricolour. "Our government is committed to provide security to each and every citizen. Amarchy has no place in the state," chief minister Adityanath told newsmen here, his first comments on the clashes.

Adityanath warned of "strict action" against the perpetrators of violence. Meanwhile, Union minister Giriraj Singh said that he felt the violence was pre-planned. "Had the deceased been Mohammad Ismayil instead of Chandan Gupta, there would be been a different debate in the media... We have to change this mindset," Singh told newsmen here. "The Union minister said he felt the Kasganj incident was 'pre-planned' adding that the Adityanath government would not spare anyone involved. He also referred to Bareilly district magistrate Raghendra Vikram Singh's comments on Facebook that appeared to blame right-wing groups for provoking communal clashes. "I have come to know that a bureaucrat has made some remarks on why some are raising 'Pakistan

Muradabad' slogans. I want to ask why not raise Pakistan Muradabad slogan. We raise this slogan as Pakistan kills our soldiers and is involved in spreading cross border terrorism," the minister said. "The DM's now deleted post said a 'strange trend' that had begun of late was to visit Muslim majority areas and raise slogans against Pakistan. 'Why? Are they (Muslims) Pakistanis?' The same thing had happened in Khaliam village of Bareilly. Then stones were thrown, FIRs lodged," the officer's post had said.

A short service commission Army officer before joining the civil services, Raghendra Vikram Singh, 59, was last year posted as the district magistrate of Bareilly, about 100 km from Kasganj. He put up the Facebook post on Sunday, just two days after 22-year-old

commerce student Chandan Gupta died in communal clashes that broke out in a Muslim-majority locality of Kasganj during a "Tiranga bike rally" by members of the local unit of the RSS-affiliated students' group ABVP. Minister of state for food processing Sahvi Niranjani Jyoti said the incident should not be politicised. BJP MP Vinay Katiyar, however, told a news channel that those who "support Pakistan" were behind the violence.

"Earlier, there were no communal clashes in Kasganj district as all lived in harmony. But it has come to light that there are some miscreants who support Pakistan and will go to any extent to defy the tricolour. They need to be dealt with strictly," he said. Katiyar claimed Gupta, who died of a bullet injury, was killed by the "supporters of Pakistan".

Shopian incident: JKNPP protests lodging of FIR against Army men

JAMMU, JAN 30 /-- The Jammu and Kashmir National Panthers Party (JKNPP) today protested against the registration of an FIR against Army men in connection with the alleged killing of two youths in Army firing in Shopian district.

The protesters, who were led by JKNPP chairman Harsh Dev Singh, protested at the Exhibition Ground here and accused the state government of appeasing anti-nationalists and separatists in the Kashmir Valley. They shouted anti-government slogans and demanded that the FIR be withdrawn.

"Two civilians were killed when Army personnel fired at a stone-pelting mob in Shopian district of Jammu and Kashmir on Saturday, prompting chief minister Mehbooba

Mufti to order an inquiry into the incident. Police had on Sunday filed an FIR under sections 302 (murder) and 307 (attempt to murder) of the Ranbir Penal Code against the personnel of 10, Garhwal unit, of the Army."

The Major, who led the Army personnel at the time of the incident, was also named in the FIR. Singh claimed "the Army men fired in self-defence when a mob attacked them". He alleged the government had earlier "buckled under pressure from separatists and directed police to register FIRs against Major Nitin Leetul Gogoi for countering stone pelters during the bypoll in Srinagar on April 9 last year". Meanwhile, the ruling BJP today created a ruckus in the Legislative Council demanding

an apology from a National Conference MLC for raising the issue of 'azadi' on the floor of the House. As the House began for the day, BJP members led by MLC Surinder Ambarar stood up and protested against NC MLC Showkat Ahmed Ganie.

"In a very noisy session, they demanded an apology from the NC legislator. They also entered into a verbal duel with NC members over the issue. Later chairman Haji Anayat Ali intervened and told the house that words spoken by Ganie have been expunged so members should sit down. Ganie had on Monday raised the issue of 'azadi' on the floor of the Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Council, drawing angry protests from BJP members. Later, Ali expunged the NC member's remarks.

FB post on RSS leader drausflak**

MANGALURU, JAN 30 /-- An alleged derogatory post on a senior RSS leader in Dakshina Kannada district has gone viral drawing criticism from various quarters against the 'objectionable' remarks on him. A group called 'True Media Network' had on its Facebook page on January 28, bearing an image of erstwhile ruler of Mysore Kingdom, Tipu Sultan, posted a picture of Kalladka Prabhakar Bhakt clad in RSS uniform and holding a club in his hand. In another photo, he is seen doing 'Suryanamaskar', a yoga pose. The two pictures of Bhat were merged with that of a pack of dogs and captioned in an objectionable manner calling him 'Muduka Bhayothpadaka' (extremist old man). When contacted, Dakshina Kannada district superintendent of police, BR Ravikanth Gowda said stringent action would be taken against those who make derisive comments against rivals on the social media.

'Drunk' cop rams vehicle into scooter, 2 injured

HYDERABAD, JAN 30 /-- Two persons were injured after a police inspector rammed his four-wheeler into a scooter allegedly under the influence of alcohol here, police said today. The incident took place around 8 pm on Monday at Yapral area in the city.

Inspector G Girish Rao (51), working at Police Training Centre in Medchal, was driving an MPV (a private vehicle) when he lost control and hit some vehicles, police they said. Rachakonda Police Commissioner Mahesh M Bhagwath said Rao was driving the vehicle in a "drunken" state and in "rash and negligent" manner.

Decomposed body of woman found in Delhi

NEW DELHI, JAN 30 /-- The decomposed body of a 30-year-old woman was found inside a bed box at her rented house in southeast Delhi's Gopindpuri area today, police said.

The husband of the deceased, who was missing, was the primary suspect in the killing, they said. At around 4.30 pm, the police were informed about the body by an acquaintance of the woman who had come to the house after detecting a foul smell emanating from it, they added. The woman was identified as Maria Meshi. She had shifted to the house one-and-a-half month ago with her husband Suresh Mehra (29), Deputy Commissioner of Police (Southeast) Chinmoy Biswal said. A hunt was launched to nab the husband, Biswal said, adding that the body was taken to AIIMS for postmortem.

Actress files molestation case against bizman

MUMBAI, JAN 30 /-- A city-based veteran Bollywood actress has filed a molestation complaint against a local businessman who is known to her, police said today. A Juhu police station official said the actress (66) and the accused (38) are known to each other, but are not on talking terms of late following some dispute. He said the accused, also a resident of upscale Juhu, kept calling the actress and even used to stalk her even after she had asked him against doing so. The actress approached the police on Monday and lodged a complaint. Police have registered an FIR under sections 354 D (stalking), 309 (word, gesture or act intended to insult the modesty of a woman) and other relevant sections of the IPC against the businessman, the official said.
