

Markets extend winning run for 5th day; macro data eyed

MUMBAI, APRIL 11 /-/- Markets finished with modest gains in see-saw trade on Wednesday as investors took comfort from ADB's optimistic growth projections for India amid US and China toning down their trade rhetoric.

The 30-share Sensex gained 69 points to 33,940.44, while the broader NSE Nifty finished at 10,417.15, up 14.90 points.

This was the fifth straight session of gains for the key indices. Sustained buying by domestic institutional investors (DIIs) and a mixed trend in foreign Asian houses following overnight gains at the Wall Street helped key indices close in the positive zone, brokers said. Investors are now focusing on key



macroeconomic data, including retail inflation and GDP growth. The sector numbers due tomorrow and corporate results starting Friday, they added.

Meanwhile, the Asian Development Bank (ADB) said India's economic growth will rise to 7.3 per cent this fiscal and further to 7.6 per cent in the next financial year, retaining the fastest-growing Asian economy on the back of GST and banking reforms.

On the global front, US President Donald Trump welcomed his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping's pledge to open up the world's second largest economy, even as the White House ruled out reversing the 25 per cent import tariffs on Chinese products, saying America wants "concrete actions" from Beijing.

The sensex resumed higher and advanced to 33,981.54, but soon slipped on profit-taking to touch a low of 33,750.74, before settling up 69.19 points, or 0.18 per cent, at 33,940.44.

MFs see redemptions of Rs 50k-cr in March

NEW DELHI, APRIL 11 /-/- Mutual funds witnessed huge redemptions of over Rs 50,000 crore by investors in March on strong outflow from liquid and debt funds, according to industry body Amfi.

Besides, MF schemes saw a net inflow of Rs 2.72 lakh crore in 2017-18, much lower than Rs 3.4 lakh crore seen in the previous financial year.

Net inflows into equity MFs was mainly driven by contributions from liquid or money market segment. Besides, income segment too witnessed outflow.

Liquid funds witnessed redemptions to the tune of Rs 54,799 crore last month, while income segment saw a net outflow of Rs 13,719 crore.

However, equity segment saw an inflow of Rs 2,954 crore, making it the lowest since July 2016, when such category had witnessed an infusion of Rs 2,221 crore. This could be attributed to investors claiming exemption on long-term capital gains.

Finance Minister Arun Jaitley, in his budget speech, had announced a long-term capital gains tax of 10 per cent on equity gains beginning February 1, 2018 - on gains exceeding Rs 1 lakh.

The statement clarified that the proposed long-term capital gains tax on equity holdings will apply on profits made from sale of shares on or after April 1, 2018. (PTI)

Bandhan-Konnagar NGD program benefitted 70k families: Ghosh

KOLKATA, APRIL 11 /-/- Bandhan-Konnagar, an NGO founded by Bandhan Bank MD Chandra Sekhar Ghosh, Wednesday said its Targetting the Hardcore Poor (THP) program has benefitted nearly 70,000 families in several states.

"We have able to benefit around 70,000 families in states like West Bengal, Rajasthan and Jharkhand," Ghosh said on the occasion of Bandhan Development Day. Ghosh said the idea was to convert one person from the poorest of the poor families into a successful entrepreneur.

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Rupee plunges to 5-mth low of 65.31 on crude price surge

MUMBAI, APRIL 11 /-/- The rupee Wednesday nosedived 32 paise to hit a fresh five-month low of 65.31 against the US dollar as surging crude oil prices and growing geopolitical uncertainties rattled the forex market sentiment.

This is the lowest closing for the home currency since November 14, 2017, when it had ended at 65.42 against the greenback.

Brent crude, an international benchmark, is trading near a four-year peak of USD 71.70 a barrel in early Asian trade.

A sense of volatility prevailed in the domestic currency market after a rapid surge in global crude prices driven by prospects of geopolitical uncertainty in the Middle East following US President Donald Trump's promise to respond forcefully to the suspected chemical attack in Syria.

Heavy dollar demand from state-owned banks, likely on behalf of oil marketing companies and corporates, along with broad-based dollar strength against some currencies overseas largely pressured the Indian currency. Persistent capital outflows too kept the local unit under pressure.

Moreover, currency traders preferred to stay on the sidelines and avoided taking any long positions ahead of key macroeconomic data release - industrial production and inflation - tomorrow.

The intense volatility pulled the rupee to hit a fresh low of 65.32 intra-day during mid-afternoon after a sense of panic rippled through currency trading floors.

In contrast, domestic bourses maintained their upbeat trend for the five straight sessions.
