Militant held in Arunachal

ITANAGAR, AUG 12 /-/- Security forces in Arunachal Pradesh apprehended a cadre of the NSCN (IM) with arms and ammunition from the Changlang district. The Jaipur Battalion of Assam Rifles undertook an operation at M. H. Khan in the district last night and apprehended the rebel on specific intelligence inputs. Centre closely monitoring situation in flood-hit Tripura

NEW DELHI, AUG 12 /-/- The Union government is closely monitoring the rescue and relief operations in flood-affected Tripura, where NDRF personnel have been rushed to assist the state administration.

"We are in touch with our teams," Union minister of state for home affairs Kiren Rijju told newsmen here. Rijju said one team of the National Disaster Response Force was mobilised from Agartala for Ashram Chamani colony village in West Tripura district yesterday as the water level had gone up due to an increase in water in Hoara. During their operations, the team evacuated 357 flood affected people yesterday from the area to a safer place. The NDRF personnel have now moved to Pratarghata village in the Defence spokesman Colonel Chiranjeev Konwar said. A pistol and live ammunition were recovered from his possession. Pradip Chakraborty said that at least 2,500 families were affected due to flood in the district and were sheltered in 60 relief camps opened in the government buildings and relief materials were distributed since Friday. Chowdhury said many parts of Khowai district were also inundated and many people were rendered homeless. Chief minister Manik Sarkar on Friday reviewed the flood situation in Tripura and asked the administration to arrange for shelter to the people who were rendered homeless and distribute relief materials to them.

The state government has declared a three-day public holiday to all the schools in the state in view of the flood. Director of public instruction Dilip Saha said the regional weather station here recorded 116.55 mm of rains. He said there was possibility of widespread rain in the next two days. The movement of people and vehicles came to a halt, many shops were closed and attendance in government offices, banks and schools was affected. Floods were also reported in Howrah river. Like all new systems GST has implementation issues which are being sorted out and the Government has formed an Empowered Committee consisting of 30 ministers and 180 IAS officers to address the same. "The minister said. He also said that post implementation of GST West Bengal alone had recorded 56000 new registrations amongst the 13.2 lakh new registrations made all over India. "This implies that same technology makes the system easier and encourages new businesses to start the same. CB based on digital transactions which makes the system corruption free and efficient needs to be accepted with an open mind," the minister said.

Doctors positioned at Bihar health minister's home, Lalu alleges misuse of position

PATNA, AUG 12 /-/- RJD president Lalu Prasad Yadav today accused Bihar health minister Mangal Pandey of misusing his position by deputing doctors at his home.

Prasad sought to turn tables on the BJP which had earlier raised a similar charge against him. He said that his son Tej Pratap was the health minister. He alleged four doctors had brought up duty at his home. "The BJP has raised hue and cry over a similar situation when some doctors and an ambulance were stationed by former health minister Tej Pratap Yadav to cater to needs of the people bringing him for help. But why they sitenow", Prasad told newsmen.

The senior BJP leader launched a scathing attack at the RJD president for drawing comparisons of the incident with the one when Tej Pratap was the health minister. "During RJD's time doctors and ambulances were on round-the-clock duty at 10 Circular Road residence of Rabri Devi to serve the family but in my case they were there for a short period of time to help the public," he claimed. "It's my official residence but neither I nor my family stays in the bungalow. My official bungalow is used for disposal of official work catering to the problems of needy," he said.

The RJD president also sent an official letter dated August 11 purportedly putting doctors in rotation at the new health minister's residence. Prasad said he had written the letter in support of his charges. Prasad sought the resignation of the health minister for allegedly misusing the position. However, Pandey accused the RJD president of "spreading lies". Pandey told PTI that for five days from August 2-7, some doctor were at his official residence to provide service to the public and dispose of some official work. One Wakil Sahni, a resident of Bhopatpur village under Kotwa police station of East Champaran district, had lodged a complaint with the Vigilance Investigation Bureau that the sub-inspector-cum-Bhopatpur OP in-charge was demanding a bribe of Rs 10,000 for arresting an accused besides helping the complainant in a case diary in connection with a case lodged with Kotwa police station, the release said.

Flood situation deteriorates drastically in Assam, 5 die

GUWAHATI, AUG 12 /-/- The flood situation in Assam has drastically today and claimed five lives while affecting nearly 11 lakh people across 19 districts.

According to a report by the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA), two persons died in Dhemaji and one each in Lakhimpur, Kokrajhar and Moriganj districts. With these, the total number of persons who were killed in flood-related incidents across Assam this year rose to 89, including 20 in Guwahati. The ASDMA said 11 lakh people are affected in Dhemaji, Lakhimpur, Bisanwanth, Sonitpur, Baksa, Barpeta, Bongaigaon, Chirang, Kokrajhar, Dhubri, South Salmara, Moriganj, Golaghat, Jorhat, Majuli, Sivasagar, Charaideo, Dibrugarh and Tinsukia districts. The ASDMA report said Dhubri is the worst affected where 1.92 lakh people have followed by Dhemaji where 1.51 lakh people have been affected. The calamity. Currently 1,752 villages are under water and over one lakh hectare crop area has been damaged, ASDMA said. "The flood has damaged embankments, roads, bridges and other infrastructures in Dhemaji, Darrang, Chirang, Kokrajhar, Bongaigaon, Charaideo, Dhubri, Tinsukia, Sivasagar, Majuli, Sonitpur, Lakhimpur, Barpeta, Baksa, Dima Hasao, Golaghat and Moriganj districts. The authorities have opened 268 relief camps and distribution centres in 14 districts, where 63,797 people are taking shelter at present. At least 2,600 people have been evacuated to safer places by SDRF and NDRF personnel in many districts. The ASDMA said massive erosions have been witnessed at various places in Bisanwanth, Brahmaputra is now flowing above the danger mark at Nimatighat in Jorhat, Dibrugarh town,

Tezpur in Sonitpur and Dhubri town. Other rivers like Bribidighat in Khowang in Dibrugarh, Subansiri at Badatighat in Lakhimpur, Dhanisiri at Numalighat in Golaghat, Jia Baralati at Sonitpur, Sankar in Sonitpur, Puthimari at NH Road Crossing in Kamrup, Beki at Road Bridge in Barpeta, Gaurang at Kokrajhar town and Chankhali at Golaghat. Dhubri are also flowing above danger marks, it added. (PTI)

Meghalaya's South Garo Hills affected

"Landslides and flood waters have affected the movement of the vehicles," the official said. He said the Baghmara police station has been damaged due to mudslides. There were also reports of flood in villages under the flood in West Garo Hills district. The government officials have been rushed to Dalu to take stock of the situation. There were reports of landslides and landslides in different parts of West Khasi Hills due to incessant rain. The water level at the Umiam reservoir in Ri-Bhoi district was nearing the danger level and has been opened as a precautionary measure. Chief minister Mukul Sangma has directed the district administration to take all necessary steps.

Heavy rains since Thursday night flooded the Baghmara, Chirang, Baghmara headquarters of South Garo Hills, and other adjoining areas bordering Meghalaya, an official said today. Though no loss of life has been reported so far, several people have been displaced following the floods. District Police Officer Sangma told newsmen. "A police team with the assistance of the Border Security Force has rescued several people trapped in the flood waters in their houses this morning," Sangma said. Some of the displaced people in Baghmara have been accommodated in a relief camp, he added. Sangma said the other flood affected areas include Karakul, Dimapara and Gasuapara.

Shatrughan demands ban on tobacco items with prohibition

KISANGANJ, AUG 12 /-/- Senior BJP leader Shatrughan Sinha today sought a ban on consumption of tobacco products along with prohibiting liquor to protect people from dreaded diseases like cancer which a study says would be the greatest killer in the world. Sinha was speaking after laying foundation of a cancer awareness, testing and advisory centre at Kisanaganj in Bihar. Congress MLA Shakeel Ahmad Khan and Independent MLA Brijendra Chandra Singh were present. A cancer surgeon J K Singh was present on the foundation laying occasion of "Gramen Sneh Foundation". "Liquor ban in Bihar is highly appreciated. But, if prohibition is extended to tobacco, it would have more effect on human health by preventing dreaded disease like cancer," he said. Sinha, BJP Lok Sabha member from Patna Sahab and who served as Union health minister in NDA government of Atal Bihari Vajpayee government, highlighted ill effects of consumption of tobacco items like cigarette, khaini and gutka. A study suggests that by 2020 cancer would be the biggest killer of human being in the world, he said. Oral cancer is widely prevalent in India and within the country its present in a gigantic magnitude in BIMARU states including Bihar. Sinha said he would work to open one such centre of cancer by the foundation in near Bakhtyarpur and Dantiyawa in his Patna Sahab Lok Sabha constituency.

JU students' sit-in lifted

KOLKATA, AUG 12 /-/- The sit-in demonstration by Jadavpur University students was lifted early today, after the university authorities assured them of communicating their sentiments to the government regarding provisions of a bill. The Bill, West Bengal Universities and Colleges (Administration) Regulation) Bill-2017, would enable the government to have the power to prescribe rules and procedures for conducting students body or union election. It was passed in the Assembly in February this year. "We lifted the sit-in as the Executive Council members comprising the vice-chancellor, registrar and other senior officials told us that they would communicate the sentiments of the students to the state government regarding the proposed apolitical student council model which is undemocratic and unacceptable," Arts Faculty Student Union (AFSU) leader Gitanes told newsmen today. "The sit-in was informed they have lifted the sit-in early today. They are all my children," Vice-Chancellor Prof Suranjan Das said. The students held a general body meeting that lasted for an hour after which the sit-in was withdrawn around 2 am, almost 36 hours after it had begun. Though the sit-in was withdrawn at 2 am, the registrar Pradip Ghosh and other Executive Council members including four deans and the Pro VC left the campus at 5 am.
