## Tata Steel's joint venture with Thyssenkrupp hits delay

LONDON, JUNE 12 /--/ Tata Steel's proposed joint venture with German steel major Thyssenkrupp is likely to be hit by delays as workers and investors questioned the viability of the current business plan. Representatives from the Tata Steel Europe European Works Council (EWC), formed to address issues of transnational interest that significantly affect the Indian steel company's employees in Europe, said in a statement this week that they remained "unconvinced" and also found Thyssenkrupp's lack of engagement with them "deeply regrettable".

### Industrial growth rises by 4.9% in April

NEW DELHI, JUNE 12 /--/ Industrial output expanded by 4.9 per cent in April this year, spurred by higher growth in manufacturing and mining sectors. The industrial growth, measured by the Index of Industrial Production (IIP), was 3.2 per cent in April last year. In March this year, industrial production had grown at 4.4 per cent. As per the data released by the Central Statistics Office (CSO), the manufacturing sector, which constitute more than 77 per cent of the index, recorded a growth of 5.2 per cent in April, up from 2.9 per cent in the year ago month. The mining sector too expanded by 5.1 per cent, up from 3.2 per cent in April 2017. The growth in power generation however slipped to 2.1 per cent in April this year, from 5.4 per cent in the year-ago month.

### Retail inflation inches up to 4.87% in May

NEW DELHI: Retail inflation inched up to 4.87 in May on increase in prices of certain items in the food basket, as per the government data released on Tuesday. Based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI), the inflation was at 4.58 per cent in the preceding month April. In May last year, it was 2.18 per cent. As per the data of the Central Statistics Office (CSO), food inflation rose to 3.10 per cent last month, as against 2.9 per cent in April. The price data is collected from selected towns by the Field Operations Division (SSO) and from selected villages by the Department of Posts. The data is received through web portals, maintained by the National Informatics Centre. (PTI)

### OPEC sees 'considerable uncertainty' in oil market

PARIS, JUNE 12 /--/ After months of sharp oil price rises there is now considerable uncertainty as to the market's direction for the rest of the year, OPEC said on Tuesday. At a key meeting of oil producers looms. Question marks over global economic growth, and resulting oil demand, as well as over US producers' capacity to pump oil at an ever faster pace are forecasting difficult, the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries said in its monthly oil market report. LUCKNOW, JUNE 12 /--/ Oil Minister Dharmendra Pradhan has promised to ease the process of purchasing sugarcane-extracted ethanol for doping in petrol, a move that will help farmers get better price for the crop and cut the country's dependence on oil imports. Pradhan, on a visit to the city to promote bidding for city-gas distribution licenses, said "For this, based on co-ordination, a way will be evolved. There is a provision of ethanol blending up to 10 per cent. In the coming days, there will be immense possibilities about use of ethanol. The farmers will also benefit from this in a major way." ## 'Indian decision to increase tariff on apples to hit US growers'

WASHINGTON, JUNE 12 /--/ A bipartisan group of about a dozen influential lawmakers Tuesday said the recent Indian decision to increase tariff on apples from 50 per cent to 80 per cent would hurt growers of the fruit in America. The lawmakers also alleged that India was abusing rules of the World Trade Organization (WTO). On May 28, India notified the WTO that it plans to raise its tariff before June 21 on apples from the already very high level of 50 per cent to 80 per cent. India describes this increased tariff as retaliation for the US Section 232 tariffs on aluminum and steel. "In our

view, India, like China and other countries, is abusing WTO rules by unilaterally retaliating in this way without authorization, and we urge you to confront such abuses," a group of about a dozen Congressmen from Washington State alleged in a letter to US Trade Representative (USTR) Robert Lighthizer. "As the second largest market to date this season, an 80 per cent tariff on apples entering India would have a grave impact on Washington's growers," the lawmakers said. For this season, more than 7.7 million boxes valued more than USD 118.3 million have been shipped to India.

# RBI needs more powers to oversee PSBs: Guv to panel

NEW DELHI, JUNE 12 /--/ The Reserve Bank needs more powers to oversee public sector banks (PSBs), Governor Urjit Patel told a parliamentary panel on Tuesday amid mounting bank loans in state-run lenders.

The RBI governor, who appeared before the Parliamentary Standing Committee of Finance, faced tough questions from lawmakers on bad loans, bank frauds, cash crunch and other issues, according to sources. Sources said the governor assured the members that steps were being taken to strengthen the system. Regarding PSBs, he held the view that the RBI has "inadequate" control over them. The Governor asked for more

There are 21 state-owned banks, including State Bank of India. Their combined losses crossed a whopping Rs 67,000 crore in 2017-18 fiscal, topped by scam-tainted Punjab National Bank which took a

hit of nearly Rs 12,283 crore. Of the 21 state-owned banks, only two banks, Indian Bank and Vijaya Bank, posted profits during 2017-18. Indian Bank posted the highest profit of Rs 1,258.99 crore and Vijaya Bank's profit was Rs 727.02 crore in the fiscal. Gross non-performing assets (NPA) of the entire banking sector stood at Rs 8.31 lakh crore at end-December 2017. Sources further said the RBI governor also answered queries regarding the USD 2 billion fraud allegedly committed by diamondaire Nirav Modi and his associates in the PNB. According to sources, Patel said it was impossible to look after each and every branch of a bank in terms

of an audit. Some members of the committee, headed by senior Congress leader Veerappa Moily, sought to know about the reasons for recent instances of ATMs running out of cash and why enough steps were not taken to tackle banking frauds. Patel told the panel that steps were being taken to strengthen the banking system. "We are confident that we will be able to tide over the crisis," a source quoted the governor as saying with respect to the NPA situation. CHANDIGARH, JUNE 12 /--/ The Punjab Finance Department has unearthed Rs 19.29 crore embezzlement of public funds in several state government departments, an official spokesperson said on Tuesday. He said the financial irregularity was detected during the audit of local funds, public and quasi public bodies for the financial year 2017-18. The Punjab Finance Department has initiated a resource pool of officers in such malpractices will be dealt with severely," the spokesperson said. The irregularities were found in the Improvement Trust, Amritsar; Municipal Corporation, Moga; Municipal Council, Rampura Phul; Municipal Council, Begowal; Nagar Panchayat, Mohapur; Municipal Council, Raikot; Nagar Panchayat, Chauke (Bathinda); Municipal Council, Anandpur Sahib; and several other gram panchayats. The embezzlements were detected by the local audit wing of the department, he said.

## ISW Cement inaugurates railwaysiding at Salboni for cargo

KOLKATA, JUNE 12 /--/ Cement has inaugurated a railway siding to cater to the booming and ongoing coal and iron-ore cargo at Salboni in West Bengal. The 6.5 km-long railway siding will connect the manufacturing unit to the main railway line between Gopabandha and Salboni, the company said in a statement on Tuesday.

"In cement business, logistics accounts for 30-35 per cent of the cement cost and to be cost effective, we are continuously working on various levers to reduce this cost. This railway siding is a step in this direction. Access to markets in the east would be economically feasible," ISW Cement managing director Parth Jindal said in the statement. The state-of-the-art manufacturing unit produces eco-friendly PSC cement for the eastern part of the country including West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar and northern Orissa.

## Liquor & fuel should not come under GST: Telangana fin minister

HYDERABAD, JUNE 12 /--/ Telangana Finance Minister Etela Rajender Tuesday said the state would suffer huge financial losses if the Centre brings liquor and diesel under the ambit of Goods and Services Tax (GST). Speaking to reporters on the sidelines of a programme, the minister said Telangana differs with some of the terms of reference issued by the 15th Finance Commission. "This (bringing petrol and diesel under GST) is not a correct decision. It would hurt the federal spirit of our country. If these products are brought under GST, state finances will be further reduced," he said. Liquor and fuel should not come under GST, he added. States should have some independence for generating their own revenue, the minister further said. On the current

prices of petrol and diesel hovering above Rs 80 and Rs 70 respectively, the minister said instead of suggesting to states to reduce VAT on the products, the central government should cut excise duty and bring prices down. Most of the welfare schemes are implemented by the states. We request the central government to reduce central excise, which has been continuously increased," he said, adding it is the responsibility of the Centre to reduce and give relief to common man. The minister said, "Though Andhra Pradesh opted out of the finance ministers on the changes to the terms of reference (ToR) of the 15th Finance Commission, Telangana would voice its concerns to the centre."

## Aircel-Maxis: PC appears before ED for second time

NEW DELHI, JUNE 12 /--/ Former Finance Minister P Chidambaram Tuesday appeared before the Enforcement Directorate for the second round of questioning in the Aircel-Maxis case, officials said. The senior Congress leader arrived at the ED's headquarter annex office here shortly before 11 am, they said. He was summoned for today after he was first questioned on May 5. Chidambaram had a department that reported to him during his tenure in the Finance Ministry. The investigating officer of the case is expected to record Chidambaram's statement under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) today, like the last time, they added. It is understood that the agency wants to put across a fresh set of questions to him regarding the deal and decisions taken by him. The agency had recorded his statement for six hours on various aspects last time. The ED had earlier recorded statements of PNB officials when this deal took place and it is expected that Chidambaram may

be confronted with these too.
